

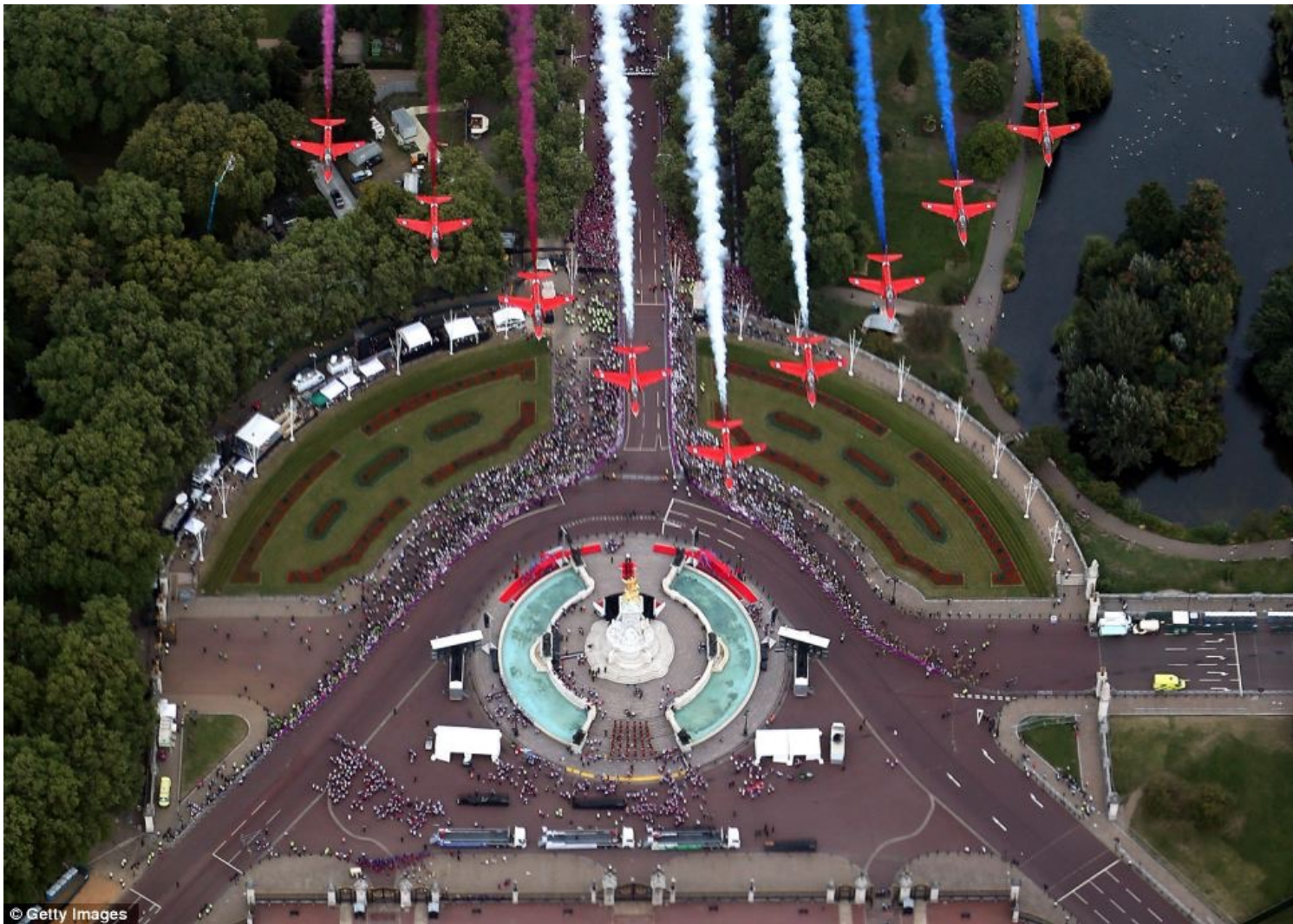
## TIME

Time is only something associated with life on earth. Time only exists on earth. The further you get away from earth, the less time exists, to the point where there is no time. That is where Yah exists in the New Jerusalem.

Time is not a dimension. Time is a part of the creation of the earth. One of the first things Dad created in the beginning was the first day, which established time. He set up the standard for time at that point.

After we die there is no more time. Time in Yah's eyes is irrelevant. It is said that a day to Yah is like a thousand years to us. Could this be? As per what I believe to be a revelation, I describe time as follows:

Imagine a big parade if you will, in downtown Edmonton. If you are in the parade, at the front, you can just see what is immediately in front of you and a little bit behind you. If you are in the middle of the parade, you can see a little in front of you and a little behind you, but if your at the end of the parade you can only see what is in front of you and a little behind you. This I believe describes how we see things.



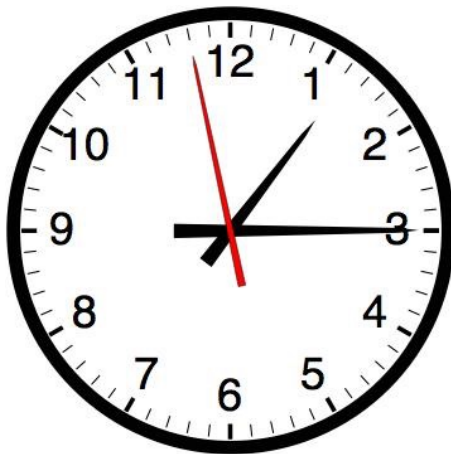
Now picture if you will how I believe Yah sees things in respect to time. Imagine being directly above this parade in a helicopter, you can see the beginning, middle, and

end of the parade all at the same time. This is how Yah sees us. He knows where we are, where we've been, and where we're going, all at the same time. We may see some things around us, we have heard things about the past, and we imagine about the future, but Yah sees it all at the same time, and therefore understands the greater picture.

Time as far as science is concerned, uses the basics of light traveling at 186,000 miles per second. This may well be true, but who's to say how fast light traveled before man was even created? This simple observation quickly reveals that if time was altered by Yah at any given point, it causes total confusion. That's one of the reasons we have fools believing in evolution and carbon dating. Both are hogwash. They are THEORIES that have somehow now been accepted as factual. Time is at the whim of the Creator. Dad can change time as He desires. For us to try to understand this is simply beyond our expectations. We are mortal, He is the Creator of everything everywhere, including TIME itself as we perceive it. It is perhaps one of the greatest mysteries of life.

Time as we know it started at sunset the first day. Therefore the first day went from sunset to sunset, 24 hours later. This first day is the day we call SUNDAY, and the week goes on from there.

Yah is considered by many to be **TIME** itself. We know that light travels at 186,000 miles per second, and we know that if you could travel at that speed, time as we know it, would stand still. If you picture Yah as the center hub of a spoked wheel, it may help you



to understand. The spokes are light, and we are on the outer rim of the wheel, He is the center. Where He is there is no time. He is the source of all light and time. Perhaps one should take more seriously **John 8:12** "*I am the LIGHT of the world*". or **John 1:3-4** "*All things came into being by Him, and apart from Him nothing came into being that has come into being. In Him was life, and the life was the light of men.*" also described in 1John 1:15. This subject of time is almost impossible for mankind to comprehend.

The whole universe operates in cycles, yet the world has been taught time-line thinking through Darwinism (evolution). We have been taught that time and history are just one long straight line instead of cyclical. Then they chop up this time into little pieces and call it dispensationalism.

You will hear many Christians use this way of thinking when they say things like: "that was in the Old Testament" or "now we are in a period of grace". **Mal. 4:4-6** "**Remember the law of Moses My servant, even the statutes and ordinances which I commanded him in Horeb for all Israel. 5 "Behold, I am going to send you Elijah the prophet before the coming of the great and terrible day of the LORD. 6 "And he will restore the hearts of the fathers to their children, and the hearts of the children to their fathers, lest I come and smite the land with a curse.**" The last recorded words of the prophet Malachi was a message from Yah telling us that He would do three things before the end comes.

1) He would help us remember the torah of Moses.



2) That He would send us the spirit of Elijah to remind us of how important the torah is for all.

3) He would restore the torah on the hearts of His remnant.

The Bible is unique in its content. The Bible's perspective of the universe, man's existence, and man's origin, is described from an external observation point outside of the created dimension, which is unique in religious works. **John 1:3** "**All things came into being by Him, and apart from Him nothing came into being that has come into being.**" **Col. 1:16-17** "**For by Him all things were created, {both} in the heavens and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities — all things have been created by Him and for Him. And He is before all things, and in Him all things hold together.**" and **Hebr. 7:3** "**Without father, without mother, without genealogy, having neither beginning of days nor end of life, but made like the Son of Yah, he abides a priest perpetually.**" This Speaks of Yah being above time and space. **Job 26:7** speaks of Yah suspending the earth in space: "**He suspends the earth over nothing**", something that until modern times required an external viewpoint to comprehend. The Bible alone among religious works, clearly states that time had a beginning. In **Gen. 1:1** "**In the beginning Yah created the heavens and the earth.**"

If you look way back to Genesis at the time of creation, the first thing Yahveh made happen was to separate the dark and the light. He didn't remove the dark for a reason. The same reason that the sun goes down at night. He wanted us to be familiar with the dark and light of the world, so that we would appreciate it when it is bright out. We now know after every period of darkness in our lives that there will be light. The scriptures (Ps. 119:105) talk about the word of Adonai being a lamp unto our feet. Adonai gave us light so we would always remember what it's like being in the dark, (Egypt/Satan's territory). Yeshua was our light until calvary. When He died, His light was not extinguished, His light was given to us, to shine through us. **John 12:46** "**I have come {as} light into the world, that everyone who believes in Me may not remain in darkness.**" Now His light is to shine through us in whatever we do and whatever we partake of. **John 9:5** "**While I am in the world, I am the light of the world.**"
