A Season of Change

There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens (Ecclesiastes 3:1)

On Sunday June 24, the end of our season with Rev. Ellie Kramer, we shared a meaningful Communion by intinction, in which Ellie greeted each of us by name as we dipped our bread into the cup. Following worship we gathered for a delicious potluck luncheon, and presented Ellie with gifts reflecting our gratitude for her devoted pastoral care during our time together: a garden wind chime (...the breath of the Almighty gives me life-Job 33:4), a glass-shaded lamp (The Light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it-John 1:5) and an Amazon gift card (she is an avid reader!) As is customary with us, our farewell to Ellie, husband Dave, and grandson Josh concluded with cake and hugs!

Now, just as the seasons turn from one to another gently and seamlessly, so our season with Pastor Patricia Miller Fernandes and her family begins. Prior to their move, the parsonage was radon-tested and professionally de-leaded as required by law. The shed doors were replaced, and painting started on the garage doors. Necessary interior repainting was done by Dave Spencer and Mark Casey. Dave Anable and Dave Spencer pruned overgrown shrub and trees, and potted planters appeared courtesy of Bruce Libby and Regina Germain. Karen Gatchell, Pamela Rogers, and Linda Hornig freshened up the Pastor's study. You, the congregation, contributed pantry and refrigerator staples and gift cards to Village Market and a local restaurant, to help tide over the family while they are settling in. Harvest Gifts Update for July

The work of Harvest Gifts has been truly gratifying. Last month, I asked for tomato cages, plants, help with watering and weeding. Although volunteers to tend the garden have been few, I was thrilled to see plants left by the garden gate to be planted, the work of a gremlin who kindly planted two hills of cantaloupe, and of course, newly arrived cages carefully placed around the growing tomato plants. So, I know you're out there - people filled with the Christian spirit of charity - paying attention and doing what you can to help.

Thanks to generous donations and the produce from the Prayer Patch, we were able to deliver 83 packages of fresh lettuce to the Hampden Senior Center and another 28 packages to the Monson Open Pantry. The Monson Open Pantry serves 22 clients, more than half of which are families with young children. It is impossible to express the deep sense of joy I experienced delivering those gifts - so thankfully accepted by our local food pantries.

Going forward, we need any and all produce you can donate beginning Sunday July 8th from 9AM - 12 noon or Tuesday July 10th and 11th from 8 - 9AM. We will be targeting the Palmer Open Pantry which services substantial numbers of families in need. This group distributes food two days a week, every week, and would be thrilled to have fresh produce to distribute.

There will be more announcements in the Friday emails and Sunday bulletins as the summer progresses. As produce becomes more plentiful, we will be expanding to include larger centers in Indian Orchard and Springfield.

Reconciliation Meeting Wednesday, July 11

Our final meeting with Margaret Keyser will take place at 6:30 on the above date. We will review what we have learned through this process of Conflict Transformation, and explore the purpose and function of a Pastoral Relations Committee within the church.

The primary function of the Pastoral relations Committee is to support and maintain an open relationship between the congregation and the pastor. The Pastoral Relations Committee (PRC) focuses not so much on the "work" of the church as on the "workings" of it. In other words the relationships between congregants and pastor which enable the tasks of ministry to be carried out faithfully and joyfully with a minimum of friction and stress. It is a confidential committee that requires a high degree of trust among members, pastor, and congregants.

Please join us for this meeting in which we will share information vital to the future ministry of our church - a committee of this type may have helped us to avoid the recent painful and destructive conflicts which arose within our church family. Your participation is so valuable, as we seek to find ways to rebuild and nurture the strong connections among us, and with our Creator, which are the foundation of healthy and effective church works.

The Little Angel Pet Treats

This is an ongoing missions endeavor intended to attract pet lovers. The dog treats are homemade, healthy and preservative free. The Bagel Nook and Hampden Professional Cleaner have agreed to display the items - many have sold.

The treat bags include information about activities at the church. Currently they carry information such as, the church address and contact information. Items featured vary month to month, highlighting church dinners, mystery plays and fairs - all open invitations to the community.

We are also considering having a "Blessing of the Pets" day the summer, with booths offering pet health information, dog obedience training, etc. I'd encourage you to think about working on this project - it takes some planning but is a one day event rather than an on-going commitment.
