

**Definitive Dates  
of the writing of  
the Gospels and the Apostolic Writings  
(commonly known as New Testament books)**

**A.D. 35 : The Gospel of Mark was inspired by God and written in Rome**

**A.D. 37 : The Gospel of Luke was inspired by God and written in Caesarea**

**A.D. 40 : The Gospel of Matthew was inspired by God and written in Judea**

**A.D. 40 : The book of Hebrews was inspired by God and written in Jerusalem or in Rome**

**A.D. 45 : The Letter of James was inspired by God and written in Jerusalem**

**A.D. 45 : The Gospel of John was inspired by God and written in Ephesus**

**A.D. 48 : The Letter to the Philippians was inspired by God and written in Rome**

**A.D. 49 : The Letter to the Ephesians was inspired by God and written in Rome**

**A.D. 49 : The Letter to the Galatians was inspired by God and written in Ephesus or Corinth or Antioch, Syria**

**A.D. 50 : The Letters to the Colossians and to Philemon were inspired by God and written in Rome**

**A.D. 50 : The two letters to the Thessalonians were inspired by God and written in Corinth**

**A.D. 55 : The Letter of Jude was inspired by God and written in Jerusalem or Israel in general**

**A.D. 56 : The First and Second Letters to the Corinthians were inspired by God and written**

**A.D. 56 : The Letter to the Romans was inspired by God and written in Corinth**

**A.D. 61 : The First Letter to Timothy was inspired by God and written Macedonia**

**A.D. 61 : The Letter to Titus was inspired by God and written in Macedonia**

**A.D. 61 : The book The Acts of the Apostles was inspired by God and written in Jerusalem**

**A.D. 62 : The Second Letter to Timothy was inspired by God and written in Rome**

**A.D. 62 : The First Letter of Peter was inspired by God and written in Babylon**

**A.D. 63 : 1 John was inspired by God and written in Judea**

**A.D. 63 : 2 John was inspired by God and written in Ephesus**

**A.D. 63 : 3 John was inspired by God and written in Ephesus**

**A.D. 63 : The Second Letter of Peter was inspired by God and written in Babylon**

**A.D. 68 : The Book of Apocalypse (the Revelation) was inspired by God and written in Patmos**

**- John was on the Isle of Patmos at the time of Nero and not only at the time of Domitian. This is based on internal evidence and external evidence recorded by the Messianic congregations fathers before A.D. 150.**
