MAY, 2022 Spring Cleaning

How many knife sharpeners or air fryers do you really need? Now's the time to start clearing out the clutter prior to deep carpet cleaning. Jessica Litman, founder, CEO, and creative director of Mama, states, "Don't buy anything until you declutter what you currently have," she says. "It will motivate you to do small declutter sessions daily so you can feel confident in any new things you bring into your home."

If you use an item- it isn't clutter- but it does need a designated place in the home. Every cup, plate, towel, knickknack, etc., should have an exact place in your home, otherwise, things will start to get cluttered quickly." Litman advises, "If you notice piles of papers on the counter, create something in your design plans where paper can be stored. Shoes taking over? Try creating cubbies for them instead of piles near the door."

MAY, 2022 Spring Cleaning

How many knife sharpeners or air fryers do you really need? Now's the time to start clearing out the clutter prior to deep carpet cleaning. I find that I can relax more after a long day of work if I come home, and everything is in its place. This gives me a feeling of calm.



As you look around your home-What is your vision? Now look at your belongings one by one and ask yourself if that item fits into your vision. If the answer is no- sell it, donate it, or trash it. Organize items so when needed, you can find it. I hate being in the middle of a meal and not find my garlic press or zester where they belong.

Too much clutter will defeat the purpose of trying to make an organized space. Be realistic when you determine which items you want to hold onto- does it serve a purpose, does it fit into your vision, does it hold sentimental value.

Jessica Litman, founder, CEO, and creative director of Mama, states, "Don't buy anything until you declutter what you currently have," she says. "It will motivate you to do small declutter sessions daily so you can feel confident in any new things you bring into your home."

If you use an item- it isn't clutter- but it does need a designated place in the home. Every cup, plate, towel, knickknack, etc., should have an exact place in your home, otherwise, things will start to get cluttered quickly." Litman advises, "If you notice piles of papers on the counter, create something in your design plans where paper can be stored. Shoes taking over? Try creating cubbies for them instead of piles near the door."

Best advice to helping to keep things organized- if you pick it up, put it away. Do not just put it back down.

Every cup, plate, towel, knickknack, etc., should have an exact place in your home, otherwise, things will start to get cluttered quickly." Litman advises, "If you notice piles of papers on the counter, create something in your design plans where paper can be stored. Shoes taking over? Organize items so when needed, you can find it. I hate being in the middle of a meal and not find my garlic press or zester where they belong.

Too much clutter will defeat the purpose of trying to make an organized space. Be realistic when you determine which items you want to hold onto- does it serve a purpose, does it fit into your vision, does it hold sentimental value.

Jessica Litman, founder, CEO, and creative director of Mama, states, "Don't buy anything until you declutter what you currently have," she says. "It will motivate you to do small declutter sessions daily so you can feel confident in any new things you bring into your home."

If you use an item- it isn't clutter- but it does need a designated place in the home. Every cup, plate, towel, knickknack, etc., should have an exact place in your home, otherwise, things will start to get cluttered quickly." Litman advises, "If you notice piles of papers on the counter, create something in your design plans where paper can be stored. Shoes taking over? Try creating cubbies for them instead of piles near the door."

Best advice to helping to keep things organized- if you pick it up, put it away. Do not just put it back down.
