# Happy New Year Looking Forward to 2021

### The Spring Valley Nature Club will have its Annual Meeting Wednesday January 6, 2021 at 7:00PM

The meeting will be conducted virtually using Zoom. All Spring Valley Nature Club members in good standing will receive an invitation by e-mail to the annual meeting where we will be voting on our proposed 2021 club budget and Officers and Directors for the Club's fiscal year 2021.

The guidelines outlined by the CDC make the prospect of having our monthly live meetings, not possible. To maintain the advised guidelines and to ensure the health and safety of our members, friends, and members of the community, we have determined that the monthly Nature Club live meetings will be suspended. It is hoped that the Covid 19 vaccinations for most people will be completed in time for an anticipated April 7, 2021 meeting (depending on Schaumburg Park District protocols) with a presentation by Donna Johnson of the Vegetable and Herbs being offered at this year's Heirloom Vegetable and Herb Plant Sale.

## Spring Valley Update for January/February – 2021

Here are the latest updates on winter operations at Spring Valley. As state requirements for public recreation programs and facilities may continue to change, sometimes quickly, please visit the Schaumburg Park District website at <a href="https://www.parkfun.com">www.parkfun.com</a> for up-to-date information. You may also call the Nature Center at (847) 985-2100. The phones are staffed most weekdays; however, if you leave a message, we will reply within a day or two at most.

- Spring Valley's grounds and walking trails remain open for walkers every day from 8am-5pm. Portable toilets are available near the Nature Center and Merkle Cabin; however, no restrooms are open for use and no drinking water is available.
- The Nature Center and Heritage Farm remain closed.
- Bison's Bluff Nature Playground is open daily from 9am-4pm, on any day when dry conditions and temperatures above 32 degrees exist. Special restrictions on group gatherings still exist; however the playground is no longer staffed and there is no fee for entrance.
- All scheduled special events for the first three months of 2021 have been cancelled. A down-sized version of *Sugar Bush Fair* will be offered as scheduled Sunday breakfasts requiring reservations (see description below).
- All winter and spring programs continue to be modified to comply with group maximums and social distancing guidelines, in accordance with Illinois health and safety guidelines.
- With on-going restrictions on group gatherings, all scheduled meetings are cancelled until further notice.
- The Heritage Farm is offering limited programs during winter and spring. A new poultry flock is growing and we anticipate getting pigs and possibly cattle back in spring.
- Volunteers continue to assist with outdoor conservation projects, trail maintenance, and with some of our modified events and programs. If you are willing and able to assist with projects, please contact Brenda Korecky at <a href="maintenance">brkorecky@parkfun.com</a>.

The Schaumburg Park District continues to closely follow the State of Illinois guidelines and additional recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC). Decisions are also heavily based on finances. Since the Schaumburg Park District relies so much on program and user fees to fund its operations – 50% of all operations are funded by user fees, with resident taxes making up the rest – the district continues to take a heavy hit financially due to the lengthy shut-down and reduced programming. For that reason, facilities that are unlikely to pay for themselves via program or entrance fees are being kept closed for now. Due to the austerity measures in place to reduce expenses, the Park District has made the difficult decision over the past several months to cut its workforce by over 20%. Spring Valley has unfortunately lost five valued full-time staff members to layoffs. The five staff remaining are wearing many hats and will be endeavoring to rebuild Spring Valley's programs and services over the next year or two, after the pandemic abates.

# **New Visitor Amenities Project Begun**

The planned project to construct new picnic and outdoor program areas, restrooms, and a new pollinator interpretive garden near the Nature Center was started in late November. The Park District was awarded a \$400,000 Open Space Land Acquisition & Development (OSLAD) grant in order to complete these new features. They are designed to better serve Spring Valley's many new visitors. Construction will continue through the winter and wrap up by early May. During construction, access to the walking paths near the Nature Center will remain open, although walkers will be detoured around the rear of the building. Bison's Bluff patrons are also detoured to a temporary entrance located along the sidewalk leading to Schaumburg Rd. Fencing is in place to keep patrons away from the construction area and off of the parking lot entrance lanes.

### **Bison's Bluff Nature Playground**

- Hours of Operation: Daily, November-March, 9:00am-4:00pm
- Playground is CLOSED any day on which rain, ice, snow or temperatures below 32 degrees exist. Winter maintenance activities may also result in closures.
- No fees required
- No more than 50 patrons may be inside the play area (includes adults)
- No Group Use permitted
- No Picnics permitted inside play area

### EARLY CHILDHOOD PROGRAMS

Based on the premise that outdoors is the healthiest place to be, these are outdoor programs for children ages 2-6 (varies by program) accompanied by a parent. All seek to immerse young children in nature, providing them with a basic understanding of the world around us while also teaching about cooperation, helping and sharing, and resiliency. Two new programs also explore farm life.

### **YOGA PROGRAMS – In-person and Virtual**

Four yoga programs are being offered at the Nature Center to provide sufficient spacing of participants, and one class will be offered virtually. These are classes for either beginners or those experienced with the physical, mental and emotional benefits of yoga. They are evening classes, scheduled once each week over 11 weeks.

### **Afterschool Nature Adventures**

Each Monday and Wednesday afternoon, kids aged 5-10 can participate in some much-needed outdoor time, experiencing nature in winter. Each class takes place at Spring Valley from 3:30-4:30pm. First session is January 13 and final session is March 31. Fee is \$4/child for each session.

## Spring Valley Spring Break Camp – Mon.-Fri., Mar. 22-26, 10:00am-2:00pm

Looking to get your 7-12 year-old out of the house over spring break? Let them spend time at Spring Valley exploring! Campers will walk to the Merkle Cabin each day for adventures in tracking wildlife, cooking over a fire, visiting the farm, and more. Fee is \$120 for residents and \$135 for non-residents.

#### **VIRTUAL – Farm to Table Series**

Learn ways to use simple, farm-fresh ingredients to create wholesome, delicious foods with these two virtual instructional classes. All ingredients will be provided via a box that can be picked up on specified dates, and the instruction will be provided via a pre-recorded video that can be viewed at home. Upon registration, you will be informed of supply pick-up location. **Endless Spuds** explores the limitless possibilities provided by the humble potato - pick-up date is Jan. 16; **Squash** explores the variety of squash and how these versatile vegetables provide nutritious and delicious foundation for many dishes - pick-up date is Feb. 13. Fee for each class is \$15 for residents and \$18 for non-residents.

#### **VIRTUAL – Farm to Table Series: Kid's Edition**

Encourage your budding young bakers to learn how to make gourmet pretzels or biscuits with these two virtual instructional classes. All ingredients will be provided via a box that can be picked up on specified dates, and the instruction will be provided via a pre-recorded video that can be viewed at home while your young chef follows along. Classes are designed for 10-14 year-olds. Upon registration, you will be informed of supply pick-up location. **Gourmet Pretzels** pick-up date is Jan. 30; **Not-so-Basic Biscuits** pick-up date is Feb. 27. Fee for each class is \$15 for residents and \$17 for non-residents.

### Farm Fun Subscription Bag

Chase away your kid's cabin fever with these activity bags! Each month, we will offer a new bag of fun farm activities and crafts suitable for 5-12 year-olds. Bags will include craft supplies, activity sheets, and a link to an instructional video. Each month's bag will include a new theme. Instructions for pick-up will be sent after registration. Pick-ups are scheduled for Jan. 18, Feb. 22, and Mar. 15. Fees are \$15 for residents and \$17 for non-residents.

### Family Woodworking: Birdhouse Building – Sat., Mar. 20, 10:00-11:30am

We'll help you to construct and decorate a birdhouse which you can then install to invite some new feathered friends into your yard. Your handiwork will help to liven up your landscape during the nesting season for house wrens or chickadees. All materials are provided, and no experience is necessary. Fee is \$15 per birdhouse.

### Campfire Pies – Sat., Jan. 23, 1:00-2:30pm

Celebrate National Pie Day at Heritage Farm by making your own S'more Pie over the campfire. Program will include a story read around the campfire while everyone enjoys their pie. Fee is \$6 for residents and \$8 for non-residents.

### Campfire Pancakes – Sat., Feb. 25, 1:00-2:30pm

Did you know there is a National Pancake Day? There is, and you can celebrate it at this program, held around a warm campfire at Heritage Farm. Enjoy a story read by the fire while you enjoy delicious campfire pancakes with warm maple syrup. Fee is \$6 for residents and \$8 for non-residents.

#### Sugar Bush Sunday Breakfast – Sun., Feb. 28, Mar. 7, Mar. 14, & Mar. 21, 9:00am-12:00pm

Enjoy Spring Valley's traditional Sugar Bush Fair on a smaller, more intimate scale! Reserved times will be available each of these Sunday mornings to enjoy a pancake breakfast with real maple syrup in the comfort of the Merkle Cabin. Attendance at each scheduled breakfast will be limited to 10 people. Registration includes a wagon ride from the Nature Center along with a guided tour of the tapped maple trees and syrup boildown. Fee is \$10 for residents and \$12 for non-residents. Reservations are required.
