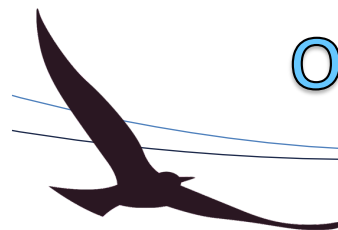

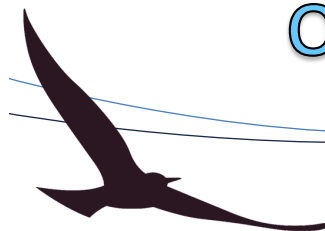

## Trevor's Column

Dear sisters and brothers,

Old friendships are precious, but unfortunately can be taken for granted. Overfamiliarity can sometimes be a problem. For example, we can assume we know what our old friend or spouse is saying, but find ourselves not really listening to the finer detail. I have sometimes found myself at the shops remembering one thing I was supposed to purchase but completely forgetting another. Of course the problem might be creeping memory loss which afflicts many of us as we age, but the fact is we sometimes don't listen carefully enough. For some of us the Palm Sunday story is an old friend acquired during our childhood perhaps in Sunday School, and which has been reinforced by our annual liturgical celebrations. Some of those celebrations leave vivid memories. A friend of mine participated in an ecumenical event in one church where a donkey featured as a star attraction. The congregation will always indelibly remember the event because the donkey inevitably and regrettably relieved itself which meant the rest of the pageant and service had to be held outside in the open air much to the relief of everybody!

Many of us have an embellished mental picture of this entry of Jesus into Jerusalem which may only be loosely related to the four gospel accounts. I suspect some of us may have never stopped to consider some of the distinctive details and surprises in each account. This year the reading is from Luke's Gospel. When the lesson is read I want you to notice a number of things. No palms are mentioned, but instead an ancient equivalent of rolling out the red carpet for an important dignitary. The presence of children is not highlighted despite their prominence in many picture books. The disciples are responsible for initiating the praise, but Jesus was actually weeping as he rode into the city. Furthermore, notice he was deliberately greeted as a king, but that his coming was about peace in heaven. All Luke's details are evocative, with the central thrust of the account having a distinctive theological purpose which Bart will helpfully unpack in his sermon.

All I want to remind you is that Jesus the king rode into the so called city of peace as the king of peace to reconcile people to God. Despite the initial welcome and the appearance of triumph, he was broken hearted by the knowledge that the offer of peace would be largely rejected. Nonetheless, Jesus the king still resolved to die to restore our broken relationship with God. Not only that he trusted God to raise him from the dead, to return him to heaven and ultimately send him back triumphantly in another royal procession to consummate his rule. On that last day he will gather to himself all who have loved him and trusted him, all who have relied on the mercy and forgiveness, to be with him forever in the new eternal city of God

## Luke 19:28-48

(Text for 8.30am & 11am)

<sup>28</sup> After Jesus had said this, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. <sup>29</sup> As he approached Bethphage and Bethany at the hill called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, <sup>30</sup> "Go to the village ahead of you, and as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. <sup>31</sup> If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' say, 'The Lord needs it.'"

<sup>32</sup> Those who were sent ahead went and found it just as he had told them. <sup>33</sup> As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?"

<sup>34</sup> They replied, "The Lord needs it."

<sup>35</sup> They brought it to Jesus, threw their cloaks on the colt and put Jesus on it. <sup>36</sup> As he went along, people spread their cloaks on the road.

<sup>37</sup> When he came near the place where the road goes down the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices for all the miracles they had seen:

<sup>38</sup> "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!"

"Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!"

<sup>39</sup> Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples!"

<sup>40</sup> "I tell you," he replied, "if they keep quiet, the stones will cry out."

<sup>41</sup> As he approached Jerusalem and saw the city, he wept over it <sup>42</sup> and said, "If you, even you, had only known on this day what would bring you peace—but now it is hidden from your eyes. <sup>43</sup> The days will come upon you when your enemies will build an embankment against you and encircle you and hem you in on every side. <sup>44</sup> They will dash you to the ground, you and the children within your walls. They will not leave one stone on another, because you did not recognize the time of God's coming to you."

<sup>45</sup> When Jesus entered the temple courts, he began to drive out those who were selling. <sup>46</sup> "It is written," he said to them, "'My house will be a house of prayer'; but you have made it 'a den of robbers.'"

<sup>47</sup> Every day he was teaching at the temple. But the chief priests, the teachers of the law and the leaders among the people were trying to kill him. <sup>48</sup> Yet they could not find any way to do it, because all the people hung on his words.
