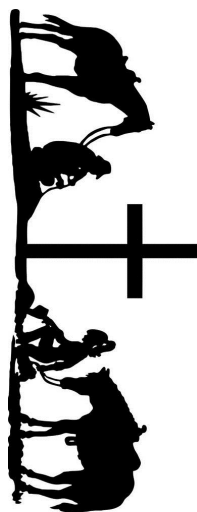

What to bring:
