Active Seniors, Inc., was formed in 1959 as a 501(c)(3), non-profit, privately funded corporation, with the following statement as its purpose:

The specific purpose for which this corporation is formed is to provide a secure social environment for seniors; where they have a choice to participate in activities which are physically and mentally healthful according to their individual needs; to have a site of congregation for social communication with their peers, that they may enjoy a fruitful existence in their latter years and be given relief from an environment of the routine of mere existence. The corporation exists to serve the senior citizens of Monterey County, California.

Originally Active Seniors occupied a building on Central Avenue. Subsequently property was purchased on the corner of Pajaro and Harvest Streets, this building was designed, built and was free of encumbrance three years after it was occupied in 1981. Community leaders worked together to raise the funds for the property and building. The building at 100 Harvest Street is where all the activities are hosted on a daily basis. We are an organization of 400 members that is run strictly by volunteers. We have no paid employees.
