What's happening in class...



Pre-K

Pre-K will be getting busy on more writing, critical thinking and math. Also preparing our 5 year old students for Kindergarten and getting assessments done.

Kindergarten

Kindergarten will be reviewing everything they learned last semester. Kindergarten students will also work on writing skills and grammar. We will continue to learn phonics, separating and blending to practice our reading. In math, we will learn subtraction, skip counting by 5, and figure out word problems. We will grow our faith by learning what happened after Jesus was born. We will learn about the different aspects of winter and have fun with arts and crafts.



1st Grade

First graders are beginning the year with Unit 4 in Reading covering lessons all about animals. In Math, we are learning problem solving skills, addition and subtraction. We are learning all about prayer in Religion. We continue to practice reading short story books independently and making sentences through our fun classroom games and activities.

2nd Grade

Second grade will begin the year reading Narrative Nonfiction, Turtle, Turtle. We will be reading and learning about Mother Teresa of Calcutta and learning about The Beatitudes in Religion. In Math, we will practice and learn about different types of graphs. In grammar, we will review common and proper nouns.



3rd Grade

Third grade will be writing informational passages and expanding on how to write full paragraphs. They will also be studying the miracles of Jesus and the connections to the Works of Mercy. In Reading, we will continue learning about Main Idea, Character Analysis and how to visualize creative writings. We will also be starting division after working very hard on multiplication facts.

4th Grade

In reading we will be bouncing along in Wonders Unit 3 reading biographies, autobiographies & speeches. In LA we will review verbs and adjectives as well as writing to express opinions. In math we are moving along in a new chapter learning division that includes remainders, area and distributive property. In Social Studies we will continue to study US States and American citizenship & geographical vocabulary. In Science we will investigate states of matter and heat & thermal energy. In Religion, we will start a new chapter on The Ten Commandments & Freedom. Kids will continue to altar serve & lector at mass as well as have choir weekly.

5th Grade

The BRATZ cannot believe that their final year is half over! They return to finish their journey through the Forest of Fractions: Multiplication and Division, learn about the power of the Holy Spirit in the Sacrament of Confirmation, and practice the fine art of writing creative narrative. In Social Studies, we are marching toward the American Revolution and the founding of the United States. Plus, we are embarking on rigorous weight training in preparation for the Stations of the Cross in Lent. So much still to do, but so little time left! Fifth grade ROCKS!!!
