The Law of God......Exodus 20:8–11 Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy.



The Confession of Sin

O Most Exalted and Righteous Father in heaven, we confess to you we are sinners and rightly deserve to be cast out of your presence forever and punished for our willing sinfulness. We confess we have not kept the Sabbath day holy or remembered it as we ought; we have not remembered your glory in creation and redemption on this day. We have despised the blessing which your Son, the Lord of the Sabbath, declared was created for us and our benefit.

We have failed to rest the whole day, we have neglected to give rest to other people on the Sabbath, but made them work for us unnecessarily. We have neither called the Lord's day a delight nor prepared our hearts and homes rightly for the day.

We have looked for excuses to busy ourselves and our minds with unnecessary and un-urgent things and thoughts on the Sabbath rather than simply finding rest in Christ and enjoying the freedom you give us to worship you and serve one another on this day.

Forgive us of our sinfulness, pardon our foolishness, and show mercy to us. Look not upon our righteousness, but upon your beloved Son who has offered acceptable worship in our place and rose from the dead for us on the First Day of the week so that we may enter your rest.
