As you read the scriptures along your journey, you will collect numbers and letters to fill in the blank spaces on the last page. This will have the scripture you need to check your answers.

*Hint: Paul will be in one of the cities listed on this map.

A brother named Simeon is looking for Paul. He is from Damascus and has been a disciple there for many years. He heard as Paul (also known by his birth name of Saul) boldly preached about Yahshua more than 10 years ago. Simeon is getting older and has been longing to see and talk with Paul again. He came to Judea to find him, but the congregation said Paul left several years ago. You are a new disciple there. You have heard many stories about the man who once persecuted the congregation, but saw the Master Yahshua and became a zealous witness and a teacher of the good news. You would like to meet Paul, and you have offered to help Simeon find him.

Start your journey:

First go to <u>Acts 9:1-19</u> to read the amazing story about Paul's calling. Fill in the #9 space on the last page with the number of days that Paul did not see.

- 1. You inform Simeon that you remember hearing that the Greek speaking Jews in Judea tried to kill Paul, and how the brethren took him to Caesarea and sent him to the city where he was born. Do you remember where that was?
- Read <u>Acts 22:3</u>. Fill in space #3 with the first letter of the city where Paul was from.
- 2. Now head to Joppa, a port city about 40 miles northwest of Jerusalem. Take a boat from there and go to the capital of the Roman province of Cilicia.
- 3. As you travel, Simeon shares with you about the early days of Paul's calling. He tells you that there is another place that Paul traveled to before returning to Damascus.

Read <u>Gal. 1:11-17</u>. Fill in space #1 with the first letter of the place where Paul went after Elohim revealed His Son in him.

4. You arrive in Tarsus, a wealthy port city along the Cydnus River. You want to get some provisions and look for lodging. As you go through the market, you see a man selling fine linen. You discover that he is also a believer. He knows two things:

 \bigcirc Paul was headed to a city that is east of the Mediterranean Sea.

 \mathbb{Q} Paul was last seen with a man who is well known by the apostle Peter.

Remember, Peter was one of the original 12 apostles that were called and taught by Yahshua Himself. Go to <u>Luke 6:13-16</u>. Fill in space #7 with the number of the original apostles named Jacob.

5. On your way to find lodging, you pass by a large administrative building. You stop to ask around and find a childhood friend of Paul's. He hasn't seen Paul for over a year, but he can tell you that Paul often traveled to: \bigcirc An ancient city that is about 2,500 feet (more than 750 meters) above sea level.

6. In two days will be the Sabbath. Tomorrow you will make your preparations, and the next day you will go to the local synagogue.

Read <u>Acts 18:4</u>. Fill in space #8 with the number of the day of the week that Paul reasoned in the synagogue.

7. It is Shabbat! You arrive at the local synagogue. As you get ready to go inside, you hear a group of men speaking about the command to repent and turn to Elohim, doing works worthy of repentance. You are familiar with that message and go up to talk with them. They are well-acquainted with Paul, and they are happy to meet you and Simeon. Unfortunately, Paul is no longer there. His help was needed in Antioch, a city in Syria. Antioch was a major center of the early congregation and became a base for the apostle Paul's travels.

Go to <u>Acts 11:19-21</u> to learn a little more about how the good news first came to Antioch. Then fill in space #2 with the first letter of the second place mentioned where those scattered by the persecution traveled.

Fill in space #4 with the first letter of the man whom the oppression arose over. He was a man full of faith and the Holy Spirit, who testified of Yahshua before the Sanhedrin. Sadly, before Paul was called by Elohim, he consented to this man's death.

8. You return to your lodging for the night. You will head to the populous city of Antioch in the morning to continue your search. Before you leave, they tell you:

Paul was last seen with a brother who is well-known for his strong faith. He is also known for being a man of encouragement.

9. You had a good rest and are ready to continue your journey. Take the well-paved Roman road and head toward Antioch, a city on the Orontes River. As you walk on the road with Simeon, you talk about your lives as believers. As you know, the life of a disciple can be difficult. However, the afflictions we face now cannot be compared to the many blessings and the great reward we will receive if we remain faithful.

Go to <u>2 Cor. 11:24-28</u> to read about some of the things that Paul endured. Fill in space #5 with the number of times he was stoned.

Five times Paul received stripes. Each time he received 40 stripes from the Jews minus this amount. Fill in space #6 with the answer.

Fill in space #10 with the number of times the Apostle Paul was sawn in two.

10. After a little over a week of traveling, you finally arrive in Antioch. You first head to the marketplace to buy food. The woman selling wine said the last time she saw Paul he was headed to:

A city surrounded by hills, which has a few valleys. It is also filled with olive trees.

11. You pass by a large aqueduct. You decide to go down to one of the fountains to fill your vessels with water. You talk with a husband and wife filling their jars. They are also believers. They invite you to stay with them and fellowship with the brethren there for Shabbat. They also tell you that Paul is staying with a man that shares:

S The name of a prophet who could interpret dreams and was thrown into a pit.

12. You meet with the other brethren there. They tell you that prophets had come a little while back and warned them there was going to be a severe famine. Their hearts were moved to send ministry to the saints. They sent Paul and another beloved brother to deliver their aid. You just missed them! They left earlier that week. They are headed to:

The city of the great King, where the tribes go up to keep the Feasts. There's only one place that can be! You know exactly where he went and who he is with! Although you can travel there by foot, you don't want to miss them. Take a boat first thing in the morning. Maybe you can still catch them!
