Kind: This week my class will be learning about letters D and G. I will be sending home D and G flashcards to add to the letter flashcards we have already reviewed. Reviewing these at home is very important, and it helps the kids memorize them faster. In math this week we will be going over shapes and comparing them in size and color. The students' math homework will be a little different from what it has been in the past. Instead of homework being the Saxon writing review, it will be an additional page from which I choose. This will enable me to send homework home for each student in the area in which they need to improve. There will also be new sight words this week. I will be sending home a list of the new words on Tuesday! I am excited to have another great week! - Miss Rachel 

1st/2nd: Most of 1st and 2nd grade have met their AR test goals for first quarter. Be sure to check with your student to see if they have finished their AR tests, as the quarter ends on Friday and they were due by the 12th. Second grade is busily working on their writing and math skills. It is very important for them to be practicing their math facts at home. I've sent flash cards for them to use and believe me I can tell who's been practicing. We have finished the remaining portion of first grade math that we missed from last year and start second grade math today, so it will be getting more difficult. Students also have sight word flash cards that should be in their backpacks to practice nightly. First grade is continuing to work on their handwriting and math skills as well. They have begun addition facts and we will continue to build on those. They will begin having spelling words this week with a test over those words

3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup>: Congratulations to Braelynn for being selected as student of the week. What a great person for the job! We are going to be busy little bees in our class this week. This week, in addition to our normal spelling tests, 4th grade will be having a math test on Wednesday. Both classes will have a science test this week over Chapter 2, and each class will have a science quiz over life cycles. You should have seen their life cycle review wheels come home over the weekend. 3rd grade's will be over the life cycle of a tadpole and 4th grade's will be over the life cycle of a plant. – Mrs. Cooper
