Preschool: Last week we finished our cute scarecrows and began working on our bats. So far we have talked about the letters a, b, l, and t. Good handwriting begins with a good, solid foundation. Continue to work with your child at home on their names. I can tell they are practicing! This week we will begin our pumpkin activities! We plan to go to the park afterwards, weather permitting! Have a great October week!

Kind: It is hard to believe we are already almost halfway through October. This week our theme will be The Three Little Pigs and The Three Bears. We will focus on being able to identify the characters and settings. Our letter sounds this week will be /g/ and /o/. We will be adding "I" and "was" to our sight words. Please make sure you are looking at and spelling these important pre-reading words with your child each night. Thank you!

1st/2nd: This week first grade will be working on writing descriptive paragraphs as we work on learning how to write complete sentences. First grade will have a math test on Wednesday, science test on Thursday and spelling test on Friday. Second grade will start a new science unit this week learning more about animals and how they survive. They will also start a social studies unit this week. Second grade will have a spelling test on Friday. The quarter ends on Friday, and I still have several with AR tests due. Have a great week!

3rd/4th: Can you believe that the end of the first quarter is this Friday? That is crazy! We have a busy week ahead of us.

Today we took our Star Reading tests. This will help us get a better range of learning levels for each student. Both grades have a Social Studies test on Tuesday and a Math test on Thursday. Fourth grade will have a Science test on Wednesday and third grade will have theirs on Friday. - Mrs. Cooper

5th/6th: In Writing, 6th graders will be working on Patriot's Pen essays this week. In Science, 5th graders will be finishing Ch. 2 and will test next week and 6th graders will be looking at physical and chemical changes. In English, both grades will be looking at possessive nouns. Students will begin reading "The Egypt Game" for our Lit. Circle today. In Social Studies, 5th graders will be working on a study guide for Ch. 1 Lesson 1 & 2 and 6th graders will be looking at Native Americans. AR Book requirements are due this Friday, Oct. 15th!

7/8 Comm. Arts: Students will be presenting roles this week over Ch. 1-4 of their Lit. Circle book "The Witch of Blackbird Pond". Have a wonderful week! -Mrs. Foster

5/6 Math: Fifth grade is learning about factors and multiples and vocabulary related to lines and angles. Sixth grade is working on the relationship between place value and expanded notation and fraction/decimal equivalents. This is the last week of the quarter, so let's finish strong.

7/8: In grammar, the last week of the quarter finds us working on nouns. This includes spellings of singular, plural, and possessives and appositives. In science, seventh grade will be finishing up their unit on the interactions of matter for the end of the quarter and moving on to a unit on Weather and Climate. Eighth grade will finish the quarter with their unit of motion and forces. Tests this Week: 7/8 Science: Tuesday -Mr. Ewing
