Kind: Only two more weeks until November. This year is flying by! This week we are focusing on the story <u>The Three Billy Goats</u>. Our focus will be on recognizing different types of text, being able to identify the characters and setting, and being able to retell what happens at the beginning, middle, and end. Our vocabulary words this week are valley, fine, rushing, roared, and trampled. We will focus our handwriting on the letters e, f, and g. During phonics, we will focus on /r/ and /m/. I hope everyone has a great week! - **Mrs. Stewart**

1st/2nd: This week in 1st grade we are reading the story Once Upon an Ordinary School Day by Colin McNaughton. This week we will learn how to use details from our text to help describe the characters. We will continue to work on retelling a story with a beginning, middle and end. We will continue working on our short and long vowels in our writing and different ways to spell different vowel sounds. Please, continue to read every night. In math we will be writing numbers through 36. We will continue talking about place value such as the ones and tens place. We will also continue to work on our math facts. The kids really enjoy those! In 2nd grade we will be reading the nonfiction story Spiders by Gail Gibbons. We will be learning all things spiders this week! We will work on writing different types of sentences about spiders such as a command, question, and exclamation. We will also be learning about ants and how they are like spiders and how they are different. In math we will start weighing objects, as well as horizontal, vertical, and oblique lines. We will continue working on addition facts. Don't forget; Students can take a test on books they are reading at home!

3rd/4th: I hope everyone enjoyed the weekend with the wonderful weather we had. The forecast this week calls for some cool, if not cold, days. With our first recess being at 9:30, it is important that students have the appropriate attire for outside recess. Layers are usually best at this stage of the year. Everyone in our class has completed their AR goals for the quarter. This week, we will be trying something new in regards to our Reading time. Students will continue to have Phonics or Vocabulit, but they will also have a reading comprehension book that they will be reading all week. One night this week, it will come home with them with a reading log. I would like each student to read it to an adult and the adult to complete the log and sign it stating it was read. The intent of this is to hopefully improve reading comprehension skills. On Wednesday, third grade will have a math test. On Thursday, fourth grade will have a math test along with a science test over chapter 4. Science study guides will come home today. - Mrs. Cooper

5th/6th: In Writing, 6th graders will be working on the body of their Patriot's Pen essays this week. In Science, 5th grade will be starting a new unit on the "Water Cycle" and 6th grade will test over Ch. 1 "The Properties of Matter" on Friday. In English, both grades will be looking at verbs and direct objects. In Reading, students will read Ch. 3 in our Lit. Circle book and present roles on Thursday. In Social Studies, 5th grade will still be learning about the Revolutionary War and 6th grade will be getting ready to test next week over Ch. 2 "Native Americans of North America". 1st Quarter AR Book Requirements (5th -8th grade) are due this Wed., Oct. 19th!

7th /8th Comm. Arts: Students will be finishing their Patriot's Pen essays this week and will be getting ready to test over "theme" and "symbolism". - Mrs. Foster

5/6 Math: As we come to the end of the quarter, fifth graders are looking at problems involving comparing and elapsed time, the types of triangles, and the nature of fractions. In sixth grade, students are looking at numbers in expanded notation, problems involving elapsed time, and fraction/percent equivalencies. Tests This Week: 5th Math: Tuesday 7/8: The seventh and eighth graders will conclude the quarter in grammar by continuing their unit on verbs. This will include transitive and intransitive, subject/verb agreement, and predicate nouns and adjectives. In math, seventh grade is working with coordinate planes, metrics, and comparing decimal numbers. In pre-algebra, students are looking at solving equations, overall average, and more difficult problems involving order of operations. In algebra, students are doing algebraic factoring and identifying and graphing inequalities. Tests This Week: 7/8 Science: Wednesday, Algebra: Tuesday, Pre-Algebra: Thursday — Mr. Ewing
