
Library Notes

The meeting room at Mote Marine hosted "40-45" members and guests for the January 11, 1996 meeting of the SSC.


Elsie Doyle and Barbara Myers noted that they have formed a shell club in Englewood.

Siratus Beauii (Fischer & Bernardi, 1857)

Sarasota Shell Club's logo was chosen January 10, 1969. At that time our logo was known as *Chicoreus beauii* or *Beau's Murex*. It was reported local captains dredging in the Gulf of Mexico brought up a beautiful specimen that attracted some club members attention. This specimen was *Chicoreus beauii* and was chosen to be our club's logo. A few years ago it's Latin name was changed to *Siratus beauii* from *Chicoreus beauii*.

Siratus beauii is a specimen we can't find walking our local beaches. It can only be found by dredging in moderately deep waters 200-400 fathoms (660 to 1315 ft. deep) along the west coast of Florida in Tampa Bay, Gulf of Mexico, southern Bahamian Islands, and in southern Atlantic Ocean waters off southern Brazil. A few specimens have been found in the deep waters of near Guadeloupe, French Guiana and Venezuela.

dark bands along the body whorl of the shell. Occasionally a white or very pale specimen also has been dredged. This species shows variations in the size of its spines and webbed varices (its wing-like expansions). This Muricid family member is a predator eating bivalves and other marine snails it comes in contact with.

Siratus beauii is a gastropod belonging to the Muricidae Family. Specimens dredged range in length from 60 to 90 mm (about 3.5 inches). Many specimens show variations in color with various shades of brown or tan on their shells. Some with

There are two forms of this shell. Each form has different variations in color. One form has sharp spines along its body whorl (**Figure 1**) and the second form has webbed wing-like protrusions along its body. **Figure 2** Our club chose this "winged" form for our club's logo.




Winning bidders will be contacted to arrange for some type of pick-up plan at which time payment will be due.

Sarasota Field Trips Update

We had hoped to schedule a few local field trips starting in January 2021 but it has been very difficult to plan these trips with the COVID pandemic still escalating.

Here are a few possibilities for upcoming trips-

•CareFree Learner Collecting Trips-

Dec 16th trip was canceled due to the Coronavirus as per the direction of the school administration who were not allowing any adult collecting trips.

Trips still scheduled (depends upon the school decision on allowing trips) for Jan. 13th and Jan 29th.

Both dates have good low tides. I will be in contact with Dr. Megan Ehlers who runs the CareFree Learner Program as to when the decision and conditions of the trip will be made.

If you are interested in both/either of the trips, please send ASAP, your response and contact information to Karen Huether at khuether@comcast.net.

The cost is \$5.00 per person. I will create a trip list to give to Megan. We will have to wear masks and seating may be limited if we get to go.

•**Keewaydin Island Trip** – Ferry Shuttle to Keewaydin from Marco Island. If people are interested, we may be able to schedule a Keewaydin Island trip for our club. If we can get 16 to 18 people interested, I might be able to rent the Hemingway Shuttle for Saturday, Jan 30th. The low tide is at 8:36 and at a negative .6. The cost is \$50.00/person (plus a tip for the Captain at your discretion). If members are interested, please contact me at khuether@comcast.net. I will need to determine quickly, if they will rent the boat to us and allows us to go out at 8:00 a.m. (that is earlier than normal departures for them). If we have enough people, I will charge the amount on my credit card and collect the checks from you all as reimbursement. We wear masks on the shuttle and they are limiting the amount of people on the ferry. You can take your beach chairs and coolers. The ramp to get on and off the boat is very accommodating for everyone. Again, please respond ASAP so that I can coordinate it.

•**An additional local trip** may be scheduled for February at Skyway Bridge/Blackthorn park area if any interest. Tides are not that great in March or April but I will keep looking.

In addition, Gary Martinez and I will be putting out a Shelling Survey for our club in January to determine interest and suggestions for future field trips. Please fill out the survey even if you think your beach shelling days are over – we want to collect as much data as possible to provide historical and current information.
