Hosea 11 & 12 A Lesson in Faithfulness

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Background

- •The date is now circa 725 B.C.
- •Hoshea is the last King of Israel
- •Shalmaneser V is the king of Assyria

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Background

- •The northern kingdom is corrupt and immoral
- •Covenants with other nations have been made, including Assyria
- •Hoshea has broken the covenant with Assyria and entered into one with Egypt

Background

- •The nation has walked away from God and is empty spiritually
- •They still practice religion though in order to gain blessings from God

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Chapter 11

- •Verse 1 key words are:
- *Love God's "hesed" love, His covenant love
- •Called chosen by God for a special relationship with Him

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Chapter 11

- •Verse 1 key words are:
- *Love God's "hesed" love, His covenant love
- •See 2 Tim:11-13
- •Called chosen by God for a special relationship with Him
- •See 1 Pet 1:1-2; 2:9-10

- •Verse 1 Note "Out of Egypt I called my son"
- *Applied to Jesus in Mt 2:13-23
- *Jesus is the perfect example and fulfillment of Israel's covenant keeping

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Chapter 11

- •Verse 2 BUT:
- ·Israel has walked away from God
- His love and His calling
- •They heard His voice and chose to ignore it

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Chapter 11

- •Verse 3-4: Though God raised Israel as His own
- ·Helped them learn to walk
- ·Healed them when sick and diseased
- ·Cuddled them and held them close
- •Fed them
- •God poured Himself out for them

- •Verse 5-7 BUT
- •Israel rejected God and went their own way
- •Israel refused to repent
- *No change of heart before God
- ·Only lip-service to God

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Chapter 11

- Verse 5-7 AS A RESULT:
- $\begin{tabular}{l} `Israel would find themselves back in Egypt \end{tabular}$
- ·A reversal of the exodus
- •The blessings of the covenant are no longer theirs to enjoy
- They will experience the curses of breaking covenant with the Almighty God

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Chapter 11

- ${}^{\bullet}Verse~8\text{-}11-YET~God~will~not~give}$ up on them
- •He will not break His covenant with them
- He will remain faithful to His word
 The curses of the covenant will be
- •The curses of the covenant will be enacted
- •Yet they will not be completely destroyed

•Verse 8-11 – YET God will not give up on them

•Question: Why would God not give up on them?

·Wouldn't you?

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Chapter 11

 ${}^{\bullet}\text{Verse 8-11} - \text{YET God will not give}$ up on them

Answer: God does not act like us. God is holy

•God's holiness means:

*A guarantee of His faithfulness toward us in both word and action.

*He cannot be anything other than perfectly faithful and true

- ·He seeks to purify and restore

Answer: God does not act like us. God is holy

- ·God's holiness means:
- •He desires that all people come unto salvation
- •See 1 Tim 2:4; 2 Pet 3:9

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Chapter 12

Verses 1-2: The charge against Israel $^{\circ}$ See 4:1; 5:1; 8:1

- · Full of lies and deceit
- $\, \cdot \, \mathrm{Refusal} \,$ to come under the guidance of God
- Pursues vanity see 8:7
- Trusts in man's strength rather than God's

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Chapter 12

Verses 3-5: A History Lesson

- Choosing of Jacob Gen 25:26
- •Jacob wrestles with God Gen 32:24-30
- $^{\circ} The\ ladder\ to\ heaven\ at\ Bethel-Gen\ 28:12-19$
- ${}^{\circ}$ Blessed by God at his return to Bethel Gen 35:1-15

Verse 6: How to gain a blessing:

- •Return to God repentance of sins
- Practice 'hesed' love toward others
- Practice justice toward others
- •Wait on God do not move without Him

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Chapter 12

Verse 7-8: BUT

- ·Israel does not practice love and justice
- ·Israel does not acknowledge their sin and repent
- ·Israel does not wait for God but moves on their own strength

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Chapter 12

Verse 9-11: So, God Responds

- •I am God that is a fact that cannot be changed even if denied
- •I am *your* God He has a covenantal connection, a personal connection, and even a family connection

Verse 9-11: So, God Responds

- ·Walking away means:
- *Judgement of the covenant through the curses
- •Exile from the land the *promised* land
- •The land of the covenant!
- They will be destroyed and all they hold dear

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Chapter 12

Verse 12-13: History Lesson #2

- ·Jacob and Laban, Rachel and Leah
 - ·God's grace shown to Jacob undeserved
- •The Exodus from Egypt
- ·God's grace shown to Israel endeserved

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Chapter 12

Verse 14: BUT

- ·Israel ignored the grace of God
- ·Israel rejected the grace of God
- •Israel will suffer the consequence of breaking the covenant with God
- destruction and exile

Conclusion/Summary

- · Israel was called and loved by God to be His own
- · Israel rejected God's call and His love
- ${}^{\raisebox{-.4ex}{$\scriptstyle \bullet$}}$ God continues to offer His faithful covenant love
- Israel continues to reject His faithful love
- · God remains faithful to His covenant word

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Conclusion/Summary

- •God's holiness leads to Israel's destruction and exile
- •But it does not end there! There is more to the story...
