Vimukti Girls School

It was a real pleasure to see all the girls on my February 2016 visit to our IASE Volunteer Service Project site located in Jaipur, Rajasthan, India. The Vimukti Girls School seems to move forward like a steam engine and the board, the staff, and the principal are all strongly motivated to achieve the goals toward an independent school of their own. There were only 32 girls at the school when it began in the 2004-05 school year. Now there are 500 girls who receive free education, free books, uniforms, transportation and a daily glass of milk accompanied by a banana. As Lavalina Sogoni, the Secretary, reports, "the growth is tremendous, not only regarding numbers but also in the terms of change in the attitude of parents towards the education of their daughters" (2015, July Vimukti newsletter). The basic goal is to convert socially and economically underprivileged girls, those living below the poverty line, into educated, confident, financially independent women. A brave and very important dream which is becoming reality as the first group of students soon will reach graduation. The next dream turns into another goal, which is to offer job-related skills and to help find employment.

In October 2015 a post-school support program was started for girls who complete class XII to pursue vocational training directed toward gainful employment or to prepare them for entrance exams for higher education. Currently, Vimukti School offers programs to class X and in the process of expanding the school program to reach class XII and to establish a professionally managed Vocational Centre. This brave dream will require a campus of their own which they aim to accomplish within the next 2-3 years.

And they all keep on dreaming and realizing it all when only a few years ago it seemed to be impossible. Congratulations to all of the actors who turn these dreams into reality. IASE has helped a bit over the years by being able to provide some school supplies, books, uniforms, and a local puppet show performance. So, all of you can share in their success! These well deserving students learn more than just the prescribed curriculum. They know that working together towards goals, by sharing and volunteering, dreams can become real!

Breaking Ice with Parents at Kianh Center

Kianh Foundation operates a charity funded special education centre at the Dien Ban Day Centre located near Hoi An in central Vietnam. This is one of IASE's Volunteer Service Project (VSP) sites. While the intake and number of children with autism at our centre are increasing (many are on a wait-list), Kianh still operates in the midst of a community that has little awareness of this autistic spectrum disorder. Many parents of our students with autism are at a complete loss on what to do with their children. Most of these children have behaviors that adversely affect their daily and social functions. Staff from our centre are currently helping to build parent confidence by teaching them the appropriate skills which will equip them to play a greater role in their child's development.

On March 18th, 2016, IASE president Iris Drower participated in one of our parent support programs. She facilitated a workshop about "Floor time" focusing on staff-parent interactions to expand upon basic concepts that were introduced earlier at a prior workshop. Some of the key steps taught involved: observation, open the circle of communication, follow the child's lead, extending the play and closing the circle of communication.

The workshop was a success. Kianh staff were fantastic at supporting the parents. The parents demonstrated an increase in their active participation throughout this workshop presentation. It was amazing to watch as their confidence grew through ongoing activities, role modeling and active monitoring of these activities throughout the workshop. This was a sensational start for parents to gain further understanding of their own child's development through play. We are looking forward to more workshops and training to support our parents, teachers and community needs.

The Office of Genetic Counselling and Disabled Children (OGCDC) under the roof of the Hue Medical College has been setting up projects for children with disabilities since 1999. The project of the Early Intervention (EI) in Hue City, in the Central area of Vietnam, emphasizes creating a professional environment for supporting families with children with disabilities as well as teacher training and colleague support. The Early Intervention centre provides a wide range of therapies including speech and physical therapy. Educational support is provided not only for children with disabilities in the Thua Thien Hue province but also for some nearby provinces. This centre is equipped with basic furniture and a limited resource of toys used for teaching and learning plus playing and having fun.

With the support of International Association of Special Education (IASE), the procurement of outdoor equipment and toys has created an adaptive playground at the new assessment centre. IASE also provided a bench for the parents, too! The Centre has a child-friendly environment. The children are very happy and really enjoy their time at the centre.

They are very eager to explore how to play with various toys. Different kinds of learning materials provide support for the staff to enable them to teach various skills including communication, social, cognitive, and movement. These learning materials have helped promote the classes' activities as well as the development of skills for the children.

We would like to faithfully express our deep gratitude to the IASE for supporting us with GIVING Funds. We are happy to continue to collaborate with IASE in the mission of early intervention for children with disabilities in our area in Vietnam.


