Open class entries may be made in the Fair Office June 6 to June 18, 2022 10 am to 6 pm, Monday through Friday and 9 am to 12 pm Saturday, or mailed to Lo Co Fair, PO Box 758, Bellefontaine, Oh 43311

Open Class exhibitors will: Purchase a \$25 exhibitor Pass. This pass provides daily admission. It does not include parking.

Static, non-livestock entries will pay a \$5 entry fee per Department. There is no limit on the number of classes in each department.

Goat entries, in addition to the exhibitor pass will pay \$3 per head.

EXHIBITS:

All static exhibits due Saturday, July 9th, 2:00—5:00 pm unless noted by department.

Release time is Sunday, July 17th, 1-4 pm and exhibits should follow specific department guidelines.

PREMIUMS:

Open class premiums can be picked up Sunday from 1-4 pm. All premiums must be picked up at the fairgrounds. If not picked up by August 1, 2022, the premium money will be returned to the general fund.

AUCTION:

An Open Class auction will be held at 6:00 pm, Wednesday, July 13. Items to be included in the auction will be from Department 006 Agriculture, Department 012 Home Goods, and Department 011 Crafts. Refer to the individual schedule for details. A portion of auction money is retained by the Logan County Fair for operating expenses. Adults 35%, Youth 25%.

The Logan County Agricultural Society is governed by the Ohio Department of Agriculture.

Open class exhibitions are open to Logan County residents and fairs open to Logan County residents.

All exhibits must be owned by exhibitor or minor member of the family. State health laws must apply for livestock.

All entries must be made and fees paid by 12 noon, Saturday, June 18, 2022. All entries received by the Fair Office are final. Entry tags will be issued to non-livestock exhibitors and must be attached to article when exhibited. No entry shall compete for more than one premium except Junior Fair entries.

All static exhibits must be in place by 9 pm July 9, 2022. Release of open class exhibitions should follow specific department guidelines.

The Agricultural Society/class departments will contract judges based on prearranged compensation of services. No person will be allowed to interfere with a judge during competition.

The judge will award only one premium/ placement which may be 2nd or 3rd when there is only one entry in a class. In all cases the judge will use discretion in determining the level of the award.

The Agricultural Society will take every precaution for the safe keeping of entries after their arrival on the fairgrounds, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. The Society will not be responsible for any accident involving any person, animal or article, on the fairgrounds.

Items necessary to care for or display an exhibit is the responsibility of the exhibitor. No exhibitor can demonstrate their product in such a way as to hinder the demonstration of products of others.

No person except the directors of the Society shall see or be informed of the number or kind of entries made before the closing date of entries.

Every effort is made in the preparation of the premium list for the Logan County Fair but no liability is assumed by the Society for any error.

Complaints, protests and objections should be presented to the Open Class Coordinator in writing and signed and dated by the accuser within 24 hours of the occurrence. Rule Violations may result in the loss of award(s) and/or premium(s).

The process in which a violation may be investigated could include; questioning the parties involved by department leadership

and/or the executive committee of the ag society board of directors. If it is felt an attempt to defraud the Society or a rule violated, the violator will receive written notice of the infraction and penalty determined.

The board reserves the right to withdraw or withhold, for good cause, any premium awarded.

Division 006: HOMEMADE WINE

- 1. Exhibitors do not have to live in Logan County.
- Wines may be made from grapes, other fruit, berries, vegetables, honey, and other suitable ingredients or blend of these.
- 3. Other wine: may be made from any non-grape ingredient. The wine may be of any sweetness fruit, flower, vegetable, honey, etc. entered into this category.
- 4. Ingredients may be fresh, canned, dried, concentrated, or otherwise preserved.
- 5. Wines must be amateur homemade by the process of fermentation and not blended with commercial wines.

 Amateur homemade wine is defined as wine made by the fermentation process by a nonprofessional wine maker in a nonprofessional facility (usually their home) in batches smaller than 50 gallons. The resulting product will have an alcohol content between 7% and 14% by volume.
- 6. Exhibitors may enter one bottle in each class. Submit 2 bottles, 1 for judging and 1 with label for display. The opened

- bottle may be taken home after the judging.
- 7. Exhibit should be submitted in clear or colored smooth glass bottle of approximately 750 ml bottles. Bottles of general shape called "Bordeaux," "Burgundy" or "Rhine" are acceptable.
- 8. Bottles should have nearly straight sides and a top which can be removed without tools except for a corkscrew. Capsules, foils, or other seals must not be used over the bottle closure.
- Bottles should be filled within 1" to 2" of the fully installed top or cork and must not be overfilled.
- 10. Wines should be clear and free of flotation (not cloudy).
- 11. All entries should be free on any labels or markings. Labels may be placed on the bottles after judging.
- Wines must be made by the exhibitor. If a family makes the wine together, only one person may be the exhibitor and winner.
- 13. Judging will be based on aroma, appearance, bouquet, taste, texture, aftertaste and overall impression.
- 14. 1st place, 2nd place, and 3rd place winners are awarded at the discretion of the judge in each class. Best of show and Reserve Best of Show will be awarded in the wine division.
- Class 001: Dry grape wine: defined as little or no residual sugar (noticeable sweetness) made with whole fruit or juice no kit.
- Class 002: Sweet grape wine: The wine must have definite residual sugar, made with whole fruit or juice no kit
- Class 003: Mixed grapes and fruit, made with whole fruit or juice no kit
- Class 004: Other wines, made with whole fruit or juice not kit
- Class 005: Dry grape wine: defined as little or no residual sugar (noticeable sweetness) made with a kit.

No puddles of sauces or any other identifiable markings. You may have sauce on the meat but no puddles for dipping. Any infraction of these rules will cause disqualification.

There will be three (3) judges. Scoring will be based on presentation, tenderness and taste.

There will be a Champion and a Runner-up. Prizes to be determined.

Nestle the paper in the pan and then butter the parchment paper. Add flour the the pan. Evenly coat the butter in flour, shaking out any excess flour.
- 2. Add seven tablespoons of the softened butter to a large sauté pan. Heat to medium-high. Swirl the pan until the butter starts to brown on the edges. Continue to swirl the pan until the butter turns a deep golden brown and smells nutty. Remove from the heat. Use a wooden spoon or spatula to get all the brown bits off of the bottom of the pan. Transfer all but two tablespoons of the butter to a small bowl. Transfer the bowl of melted brown butter to the freezer. Stir every three or four minutes until the butter has solidified again, and is in a softened state. (You want to it to be the same texture as the softened butter, so make sure you don't freeze it until it's hard. Stirring every few minutes is key!)
- 3. While the butter solidifies, add brown sugar to the two tablespoons of brown butter in the sauté pan. Turn the heat on medium and cook until the brown sugar has melted. Add pears and toss in the sauce. Cook pears 2-3 minutes until slightly softened. Turn the heat off. Season with a pinch of salt. Set aside.
- 4. Add flour, baking soda, baking powder, salt, ginger, and cinnamon to a medium bowl. Whisk to combine. Set aside.

- 5. Once the butter has come to a softened state, add it, along with the remaining 4 tablespoons softened butter and sugar to the bottom of a stand mixer. Beat on a medium speed until it's light and fluffy, about 2-3 minutes. Reduce the speed to low and add eggs, one at a time, until each is incorporated. Add vanilla, mix until combined.
- 6. Add 1/3 of the flour mixture to the butter and sugar. Mix on low just until the flour Has been combined. Add half the buttermilk. Again mix on low, just until the buttermilk is combine. Add another 1/3 of the flour, and mix on low just until combined. Pour in the remaining buttermilk and mix until combined. Finally, add the remaining 1/3 of the flour and mix on low just until combined.
- 7. Arrange the pears in the prepared pan. Pour any remaining caramel sauce on top. Working carefully, dollop the batter over the pear mixture and spread the batter evenly over the pears, making sure to not move the pears. Bake for 25-30 minutes or until a wooden skewer or toothpick comes out with just a few crumbs attached.
- 8. Let the cake rest for 1 minute. Use a knife to loosen all the edges. Place a large plate or platter on top of the pan. Flip and use a knife or spoon to tap the top so the cake releases. Remove the pan. Gently remove parchment paper. Cut into wedges. Sprinkle with powdered sugar.
- 9. *Be sure to butter and flour the cake pan VERY well or it will stick! *If any of the pears do stick, just peel them off the pan and arrange them on the cake. Dust with powdered sugar.

- Open judging by an accredited O.A.G.C. judge will begin at 12:30pm with quiet prevailing during judging. Exhibitors and interested persons are encouraged to attend judging. There will be no discussion about the exhibits with the judge prior to and during judging.
- 7. 1st place, 2nd place, and 3rd place winners are awarded at the discretion of the judge in each class. Any award may be withheld at the discretion of the judge. Sweepstakes will be awarded by the point system for each show. In the Monday show, "Best of Show" and "Reserve Best of Show" awards will be given by the judge in all the adult-class container grown plants, in all other adult classes combined, and in junior container grown plants. In Friday Show, "Best of Show" & "Reserve Best of Show" awards will be given by the judge in Artistic Design, Junior Artistic Design, daylilies, all adult-class cut specimens, Roses, and Junior Horticulture.
- 8. There are two junior classes: ages 4 through 12 years of age and juniors ages 13 through 18 years. In addition to premiums awarded to the junior classes, the OAGC Logan County Garden Clubs will award each junior \$5 per show for entering exhibits.

HORTICULTURE RULES

- 1. Container plants must be potted and in possession of exhibitor at least 45 days prior to show.
- 2. Exhibitors may only make one entry in cutspecimen classes <u>except roses</u>, <u>which may</u>

- have two entries. All classes must be declared on entry sheet. Tags will be printed and may be picked up the day prior to each show at the Flower Show Building, and should be placed on the exhibits before the entries are brought to the fair grounds. ALL CUT SPECIMANS MUST BE GROWN BY EXHIBITOR.
- Exhibits not meeting the specifications of the schedule will be disqualified. (Example: size of bloom as stated in the schedule, improper count when definite number is specified or side buds left on those specimens to be shown as an individual bloom.)
- 4. Horticulture exhibits must be staged in clear glass containers provided by the exhibitor, except for miniature roses and gladiolus whose containers will be furnished by the show department. Containers should be sturdy enough to hold the entry. Floating full-blown roses must be staged in clear wide mouth containers provided by exhibitor. Larger specimens (i.e., sunflowers, large lilies, and large Hosta) should be placed in a heavy container that will hold the entry without tipping. No quart or pint canning jars will be acceptable.
- 5. Same exhibits cannot be used in more than one show.
- 6. All exhibits should be named if known. ONLY CORRECTLY NAMED EXHIBITS WILL BE ELIGIBLE FOR A BEST OF SHOW AWARD BUT CAN WIN A 1ST, 2ND, OR 3RD PLACEMENT. Write the variety name in the Entry Description area of the tag.
- 7. The size of containers are limited. See class for size. Exhibitor or their designee is responsible for placement and removal of large containers.
- 8. Wedges are allowed in horticultural exhibits as long as the wedge does not distract from the entry.

ARTISTIC RULES

1. Plant material for artistic design may be secured from any source. No artificial plant

- material will be permitted. Painted or artificially colored fresh plant material is never permitted in artistic designs. Cut fruit or vegetables are not permitted. Painted dried material, accessories and line material will be permitted. Plant, dried and line material must be stated on a 3x5 card or listed on the "Entry Description" portion of the entry tag. Do not use an American Flag in any arrangements.
- 2. The exhibitor may position artistic designs. There will be no artistic design set up or grooming after 12:30 PM on day of show.
- Wilted or broken material SHOULD be replaced by the exhibitor, in the same position as judged. Exhibitors are encouraged to do this after judging is completed to keep arrangements looking fresh throughout the show.

Tell the difference between a grass and a sedge (Carex) by looking at the cut end of the stem and rolling the stem between your fingers. If the stem is hollow and round, it is a grass. If the stem is solid, peel the leaves back and roll the stem between your fingers. If it rolls easily between your fingers, it's a round stem and is most likely a rush. If it does not roll easily, it's an angular stem, which is characteristic of sedges.

No sawtooth hangers are permitted.
- 10. Classes may not be combined by the judge.
- 11. Entry name must be covered during judging.
- 12. Work entered in incorrect division or class will be disqualified.
- 13. The Committee Chair(s) makes final decisions on standard of good taste.
- 14. Specific display requests need to be communicated upon delivery. Attempt will be made to accommodate exhibitor, both for aesthetics and safety. Smaller, fragile items will be place in a glass display case
- 15. Refrain from speaking with the judge until judging is finished and the judge is ready to address the artists. Respect the judge's decision without argument.
- 16. Exhibitors are encouraged to attend the critique immediately following the judging.
- 17. The term professional is defined as: a person who has mastered a high level of expertise in a field due to education qualification or receiving income due to sale of artwork.
- 18. Premiums and Ribbons will be awarded for 1St, 2nd, and 3rd place. Only Ribbons will be awarded for Honorable Mention.
- 19. Best of Show Ribbons and Reserve Best of Show Ribbons will be awarded for Professional Division, Amateur A Far Division and Youth Division.
