Messiah Messenger A Pastoral Reflection

Dear Friends in Christ,

It's 6:30 AM and the annoying "buzz" of my alarm jolts me awake. As I roll out of bed, my mind is already filled with thoughts of all that must be accomplished in the day ahead. By the time I've finished my morning coffee, my list of "to do's" is already so overwhelming I'm not certain my work will ever get done!

Of course, whether I complete all I intended to do or not, my day still passes, just as it does for all of us. Evening finally comes, and I slip beneath the covers of my bed at day's end, welcoming a period of rest, still very aware of how limited these idle hours will be...and then the <u>race</u> starts all over again!

Friends, is this descriptive of your life? It seems that in times like these...we need an <u>attitude of persistence</u>. However, this approach to living is not easy for us. We're members of a culture filled to the brim with impatient people. Some have even described us as people of the "instant NOW!"

Waiting in line makes us agitated and angry. We're impatient as we wait for things to happen in our lives, for goals to be reached, and for God to act! We want our lives to be a sprint, when usually life is more like a marathon! (Perhaps, we need to learn a thing or two about life from marathon runners.)

Marathon runners train for the better part of a year to prepare themselves for running one 26-mile race. Though many marathoners would insist on the importance of fitness training, these runners would all agree that <u>persistence is the most crucial attribute</u> a runner needs to finish a race!

The pace a runner sets for a race of marathon proportions often is determined by what it takes for a marathoner to go the full distance. To be in front of the pack is not important!

Sometimes, because of the length of the race and the endurance required to reach the finish line, the only way a runner can complete a race is by willfully...and persistently...placing one foot in front of the other!

In the marathon of life, there will always be times when the goals we strive for seem so distant we're not certain they will ever be reached. Often, we face moments when we are exhausted despite our best efforts, angry about our shortcomings, and impatient about our setbacks. (Living through a season of challenges with COVID-19 has taught us this lesson more often than we care to recall.)

Quite simply, running the daily race of life is all about learning to be persistent! As we encounter challenges with "start-ups" for school, Sunday School, Confirmation, and a fall routine that can leave many of us feeling "winded" and "weary"...let's embrace the discipline of a marathoner...and keep placing one foot in front of the other...until the race of each day is complete!

Scripture encourages us to encounter our impatience with the challenges of daily life through these words:

"...let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith..."

(Hebrews 12:1-2)

Friends, in our race of faithful living, the prize doesn't go only to those who are first. The prize of victory goes to those who, with God's strength, persist until they finish! So...let's "keep on keeping on"...and remember these inspiring words:

"I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. From now on there is reserved for me the crown of righteousness." (2 Timothy 4:7-8)

Messiah Lutheran Church Council Meeting - August 17, 2021 Approved via Email on August 23, 2021

Members Present: Karyn Santl, Katie Gunderson, Ashley Filpula, Bonnie Delmore, Keith Okeson, Stu McFarlane, Marty Transgrud, Bob Tuttle, Kevin Wensloff, Pastor Dave Swonger, and Deacon Joanne Swonger

The meeting opened with introductions and Bob led devotions.

Katie made a motion to approve the agenda for the August 2021 meeting, second by Keith, unanimously approved.

Stu McFarlane presented the Treasurer's Report. Bob made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report, second by Kevin, unanimously approved.

Reports

- Ministerial Team Report: Pastor Dave and Deacon Joanne presented their report. They have been attending many meetings to prepare for the upcoming months.
 - Rally Sunday is scheduled for Sept. 12, 2021 with a joint worship service (10:00am) at the city park with a meal, games/activities, and prizes to follow.
 - Services on Sept. 26, Oct. 3, and Oct. 10 will have an emphasis on stewardship.
- Parish Education: Moessiah Day Camp was very successful and enjoyed by the kids that attended.
 There were over 45 students and 20 student-leaders that participated throughout the week.
- Property: A work night was held on August 3rd new light poles have arrived and they will be installed
 in the coming weeks, a leak from a sink has been fixed, outlets have been installed/repaired, and a few
 hall lights need to be fixed/repaired. The sliding doors/dividers in the fellowship hall and kitchen were
 also removed and Bob will check into a cost to replace the dividers. An inspection of the boiler room
 will be scheduled with Lee's Plumbing & Heating to ensure safety and compliance.
- Stewardship: No additional report.
- Youth & Family: No report.

Business

- Parsonage Committee Report: The parsonage committee met to discuss the pros/cons as it relates to
 maintaining, keeping, or selling the parsonage. At this time, the committee is recommending to sell the
 parsonage. At the current time, the parsonage is in need of a new boiler the estimate to replace the
 boiler is \$4200.
 - The parsonage committee will meet again to discuss next steps and develop a plan for the revenue if the parsonage is sold, appraisal, continue communicating with the current tenants, etc.
 - Bonnie made a motion to replace the boiler using a current estimate of \$4200, second by Marty, unanimously approved.
 - Katie made a motion to bring the recommendation of the parsonage committee to sell the parsonage to the Messiah Congregation, second by Stu, unanimously approved.

- Stu made a motion to hold a special congregational meeting regarding the future of the parsonage of Sunday, September 26, 2021 immediately following the regularly scheduled worship service (11:30am), second by Keith, unanimously approved.
- Review of Committee Job Descriptions: The council (committee liaisons and executive council) will
 review and update committee descriptions and responsibilities. Discussion will continue at the
 September meeting.
- Tin Cup Discussion: Discussion related to immediate need in Haiti due to the recent earthquake. Katie
 made a motion to reallocate the Tin Cup offerings from August 22 through the end of September to
 Lutheran World Relief to support earthquake relief efforts in Haiti, second by Bonnie, unanimously
 approved.
- Boy Scouts: The Boy Scout organization is seeking to develop a charter organization with Messiah Lutheran Church to help develop and support a local troop. Karyn will look into this before moving forward with an agreement.
