Pope Francis proclaims "Year of St Joseph"

With the Apostolic Letter "Patris corde" ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis recalls the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To mark the occasion, the Holy Father has proclaimed a "Year of Saint Joseph" from 8th December 2020 to 8th December 2021.

Friday 19th March is St Joseph's Feast Day **Prayer to St Joseph**

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. To you God entrusted his only Son; in you Mary placed her trust; with you Christ became man. Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy, and courage, and defend us from every evil. Amen.

Wake up, Joseph!

Or better still, rest a while longer.

You know when you have a problem and the solution is there somewhere? One option is to talk it over with someone. What often happens then is that you see what should happen: talking it over helps you find the answer yourself.

Another option is to sleep on it: what seemed insoluble yesterday is fairly easy today. Pope Francis got some help! On his desk he has a little statue of a sleeping Saint Joseph and if there's a challenge that persists he writes a note about it and puts the paper under sleeping Saint Joseph - and he finds that plan usually works.

St Joseph is the patron of Halverstown school, so I gave the Principal a statue of sleeping St Joseph for his desk. Gormanstown church is also under the patronage of St Joseph, so I put another statue there.

Why Sleeping Saint Joseph? We know more about his dreams than we know about himself: in a dream he is told he should take Mary as his wife; in another dream he is told to take Mary and Jesus to safety in Egypt (Ireland's World Refugee postage stamp depicted the Flight to Egypt), and in another dream he was told it was safe to go back home.

Saint Joseph quietly got on with his life - his quiet, remarkable life.

Friday 19 March is the Feast of St Joseph. And Pope Francis has declared this year to be the Year of Saint Joseph.
