2023 Membership Fees

• INDIVIDUAL (18 yrs. and older)- \$45

- A commitment of at least 8 volunteer hours, or 2 sessions of volunteerism.
- One session of volunteerism is defined as 4 hours, or half a day in a volunteer role in an event on, or off of DCTR premises.
- FAMILY (w/children under 18 yrs. old) \$60
 - A family membership is a volunteer commitment for TWO MEMBERS ONLY.
 - A total of 16 volunteer hours defined as four 4 hr. Sessions, or 2-8 hr. sessions in an event on, or off of DCTR premises.
- BUY OUT (no commitment for volunteerism)
 - \$45 for Individual Membership plus another \$45 for a total of \$90.
 - \$60 for a Family Membership plus another \$60 for a total of \$120.
- MEMBERSHIP SCHOLARSHIPS (as needed on individual basis)
 - No one will be turned away for inability to pay. Volunteering may be traded for the membership fee. (to be determined by Board) You must go through the Board to receive a scholarship for membership.
 - Applications coming...

Volunteer Examples...whether on, or off premises working at a listed volunteer position at horse show, clinics, fundraisers, or similar events. (Ring steward, gate attendant, trail boss, rec. info, meal prep, concession, etc...)

Workdays Examples...cleaning clubhouse, flower garden upkeep, mowing, arena upkeep, tree trimming, trash pick up, painting, repair on buildings, etc...

Douglas County Trail Rider Days at Douglas County Fairgrounds

We are excited to announce the opportunity to set aside time at the Douglas County Fairgrounds Indoor arena exclusively for DCTR members. *DCTR Days at DG CO* will start out unstructured. While not professional trainers we all can gain something from each other and peer-to-peer informational exchange. As we add more dates we will take suggestions for activities, such as roping instruction, games, beginning jumping, or poles.

Open Arena

On Thursdays, the Douglas County Fairgrounds offers an Open Indoor Arena from 9am to 9pm at a cost of \$15 per rider for the day. Open arena riding is for any kind of reasonable equine uses. It is not exclusive to DCTR, and barrel racers often utilize the arena. We are putting Thursday February 16 on our calendar to join in with the others there. We can add additional dates on our Facebook page after we see how popular it is.



De-Spooking and Parade Certification

To be part of our DCTR group in a parade you must be a current member and have passed our Parade Certification course. Every rider must certify on each and every horse they plan to ride in a parade. DCTR typically rides in several parades a year, including our yearly kick off, normally St Patrick's Day, always on March 17 and finish the year with the Old-Fashioned Christmas Parade, always the First Saturday in December, both in Downtown Lawrence. Traditionally we ride in the Maple Leaf Parade on the third Saturday of October in Downtown Baldwin. We welcome suggestions for other parades to ride in, as well as appropriate costumes to fit the parade theme.

We will doing a De-Spooking, Parade Certification before St Patrick's Day and before each major parade. Members are welcome to attend and utilize our outdoor course and obstacles set up for the certification as a continuous self-training. Keep an eye on the Facebook page for updated information, dates, and location.

Always remember weather and other things beyond our control can affect the schedule and we need to be flexible on last minute changes.
