SERMON NOTES

I. <u>Introduction</u>: What is irony and how does John use it?

II. Main Argument **A. Division (vv. 40-44)**

- 1. Conjecture About Jesus (vv. 40-42)
 - a. Jesus the Prophet (v. 40)
 - b. Jesus the Christ (v. 41)
 - c. Scriptural Objection (vv. 41-42)
 - 1) What is the irony here?
 - 2) <u>Application</u>: *People will twist the Scripture to suit themselves*.
 - 3) Application: Lack of concern causes many to reject Christ.

 - b. Why do the Pharisees suggest it is absurd to believe in Jesus?
 - c. How are the rebukes of the Pharisees rich with irony?
- 3. <u>People Condemned (v. 49)</u> a. On what basis do the Pharisees condemn the crowd?
 - b. <u>Application</u>: Beware the arrogance of authority and the pride of office.

C. Drama (vv. 50-52)

- 1. Small Objection (vv. 50-51)
 - a. Nicodemus Identified: What two things does John tell us about him?
 - b. Point of Procedure: What is the very minor point Nicodemus brings up? How is this a weak and mild defense of Jesus?

c. <u>Application</u>: *The Holy Spirit works in various ways.*

- 2. <u>Fury and Rage (v. 52)</u>
 - a. Why are the rest of the Jews so angry about this question?
 - b. Of what do the Jews accuse Nicodemus?
 - c. What do the Jews tell Nicodemus to do?
