Cost per meal allows for better comparison between districts. Total food service budget is not comparable if there are significantly more students.

The same goes for Transportation.

Color Coded to demonstrate how well a district is doing.

Comparing a district to the state average is like comparing apples and oranges - peer averages are much more accurate.



In Kyrene in FY2020, per pupil spending has increased slightly from 2019 to 2020. They are spending more than their peers and the state.





#### How has spending changed over 5 years in Kyrene?


You can see a high percent increase in Instruction spending. This allows the percentage to come very close to the highest recorded (64.4% in 2004) since 2001 (seen at the bottom of this section).

Students per Teacher is always going to look low. This number includes all of the SPED classes in the average.




