Rally Day 2020!, September 13 "RALLY AND RE-GATHER!"

for both Worship and Sunday School! According to the Ohio

Public Health Advisory System, Hamilton Co. has gone down from Level 3 (Red) to Level 2 (Orange), and other areas around us are improving slowly. Though things could still change as schools reopen, for now we are planning to come back together on 9/13 – we will keep you all posted by phone, email, and online as we draw closer to Rally Day. WE ARE ALSO changing our Sunday schedule a little: Sunday School will start at 9:30 AM, and WORSHIP will move to 10:30 AM. This allows several important changes—a new Sunday morning Adult class (starts in October); it lets our teachers and youth attend worship with their families (and older youth to help out more with worship); and our youth will not have to miss classes to have a youth function. So...plan on RALLYING BACK to SPUCC on September 13! We will have Holy Communion AND a BOX LUNCH to take out for everyone in attendance!

SERVICE

In a recent edition of "SONKA News" (the weekly online update from our regional UCC office in Dayton) our Designated Association Minister, the Rev. Carl Robinson writes: "I have been working with congregations around SONKA who are finding these times incredibly difficult and stressful. People are, understandably, afraid and confused about what the future may hold for our churches. In some cases, those anxieties are being expressed in organizational changes. The Association leadership understands and feels that stress. None of us knows what the future might hold for our churches, our pastors, or our denomination. We urge patience and courage in the struggle to be the church in communities and neighborhoods throughout Southwest Ohio and Northern Kentucky." I don't know about you, but this really hits home for me...especially the part that says "none of us knows what the future might hold for our churches, our pastors, or our denomination." Even before the Covid-19 pandemic, churches around the country, including SPUCC, have been enduring difficult, painful, long-term change and stress as our culture shifts and changes—and often doing very poorly at handling it all. And it's gotten worse.

Another of our Association Ministers in the Heartland (formerly Ohio) Conference, the Rev. Nayiri Karjian, (General Minister, Living Water Association) suggests that questions like "'When do we reopen?' should be changed to a quest to discover what God is calling us to do today so we can learn, grow, serve by

directing our energy and curiosity to viruses we can do something about (e.g. racism, inequality, etc.).


Carl and Nayiri are both correct; we <u>cannot</u> be certain of the future, so we need to ask <u>different</u> questions. Covid-19 has caused all of us to give up a lot involuntarily. But, what if we <u>reframe</u> what we have given up—<u>change how we see it?</u> The root meaning of <u>sacrifice</u> (in Latin, <u>sacrificium</u>) means to make something holy or sacred by offering it up to God. So maybe the best questions for our own wellbeing, our own faith, and the health and long-term wellbeing of our church, are questions like these: HOW CAN I OFFER MYSELF TO GOD RIGHT NOW, in this strange time we are in? What can I <u>voluntarily</u> give up? And of the things I have "lost," what can I let go of <u>permanently</u> (or at least indefinitely) for God? Perhaps if we start to ask questions like these then at least some of what we have had to give up in this pandemic can be redeemed, and used for good by God (Romans 8.28).

So much is unknown and indefinite these days. But we <u>can</u> know and <u>definitely</u> trust this: that our current time, our church, and our culture can be stronger and become more unified through <u>self-sacrifice</u> ...through <u>other-oriented</u> compassion and service. YOU CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE! That's how the "kingdom of heaven" grows, and spreads, and changes the world for the better...and, <u>WE grow with it!</u>
