Important Reminders What to do if.......

Who do you call when a street light is out? You need to call Entergy Repair/Outage at 1-800-968 -8243. Listen to the prompt and select the number which reflects your calling. This is the same number you use for reporting a gas leak.

There is a suspicious incident-how do you get in touch with our security? You need to call 389-2000. This is the non-emergency number for the police department. If one of our security officers is riding in our neighborhood they will respond immediately. If no one is on duty at that time, then city police will send someone out.

<u>Citizens Service Key to Government</u>. If you are not sure who to call for a particular problem, dial 311 and ask for assistance. Your call will be directed to the proper agency.

Remodeling or additions? Don't forget that if you are considering any outside remodeling, or adding an outside storage unit of any kind, there is a process which you must complete. Please check the deed restrictions for your filing and BE SURE to submit the correct form before undertaking your project. If it is not done properly, you may be asked to take it down. THANKS!

Gardening Tips / Yard of the Month

Due to severe weather in recent weeks, we have been unable to choose a Yard of the Month winner for January or February. We hope to resume this activity in March.

As gardening goes, February is always a tricky month. It's tempting to begin planting in our flower beds or vegetable gardens when the weather is in the 70's or

above. But February has a way of sneaking in a hard freeze or two before it ends. So, it is best to wait until mid-March or later to plant tender vegetation.

February is, however, a good month to prune rose bushes or fruit trees. Use sharp pruners or loppers to make clean cuts. This will prevent damage to the plants.

Do not prune plants that bloom in the spring, like azaleas.
