#### **Programs**

Andrea Brokenshire is our March speaker and workshop leader. She is an award-winning quilt artist, both nationally and internationally, who cur-

rently resides in Round Rock, Texas. Her love of sewing, fabric, and texture began as small child when, as one of five daughters, she began making apparel. She made her first quilt in 1998 and found this form of art expression a perfect outlet for her creativity. After a catastrophic illness in 2005 she found her own voice of creative expression and developed her "confetti" process; which several WHQG members have been anxious to learn. Andrea will lead the workshop on March 22,



2018 at Quiltworks on Jones Road beginning at 9.30 a.m. This is a two-part workshop with the first part creating the Confetti Background for the quilt and the second

part emphasizing free motion quilting of the piece created in part one. The cost for the work shop is \$35.00 for the guild fee, and \$35.00 for the workshop kit purchased from Andrea the day of the workshop.

# COMFORT QUILTERS / COMMUNITY SERVICE

Maybe we should not meet one month again, because the Community Service table was laden with quilts from lots of different guild members. Looks like everybody stayed in on those icy, cold days and sewed on charity quilts. The turn in was fabulous: 30 quilts, some beanie babies, and 2 boxes of tops and fabric from the Pride of the Prairie Quilt Guild in Plainfield, Illinois. Barbara Wenker received the boxes and brought them to us. Keep up the great work!!!

SIZE OF CHARITY OUILTS: Most nursing home quilts should not be larger than 40-42 wide and 50-55 long. They are primarily used to cover their legs in a wheel chair or across their laps while sitting in their room. Linus quilts can be almost any size. Preemies--25" square, cotton kid print on one size and flannel on the other OR flannel on both sides (no batting needed). Texas Children's Hospital cares for kids from newborn to age 21, so some longer quilts are always appreciated for those teenage boys and girls. Kits are always available at each guild meeting, but you are also free to use your own fabric.

Comfort Quilters Bee meets every Tuesday morning from 9:00 until noon at Quilt Works, 9431 Jones Road at West Road. Any guild member is welcomed to join us any Tuesday and sew on charity quilts. Kits are available or you can bring your own fabric and work on a charity quilt. Hope to see some of you at Quilt Works on Tuesday morning.
