

The Church of the Immaculate Conception is in reasonably good financial condition, providing we can turn around the decline in collection revenue. Over the past 2 years, we completed the renovation of the Parish Center, added outdoor lighting throughout the campus, and replaced the rectory siding with a significantly better siding. When the churches were closed for COVID, we began streaming our daily and weekend masses with minimal capital investment by utilizing an iphone and a wireless transmitter which connected directly to the church sound system.

Collections for the year ended June 30 2021 were remarkably good despite the severe restrictions on attendance in the building when the church reopened. Expenses for the year 2021 were significantly lower then 2020 mostly due to the completion of the significant improvements in the parish center.

We have replaced our 25 year old speaker system in the church and have begun to improve security on the campus thanks to funds specifically allocated from the Reigniting our Faith campaign.

The 2022 fiscal year will prove to be very challenging. Collections are currently coming in below budgeted and prior year levels. The current weekly rate is just over \$12,000, while the budget is \$15,000. Expenses, particularly salary related are coming in higher. At the time of the budget, we did not know what the impact of combining the 3 churches under 1 pastor would be. The decision was made in the summer to hire additional lay personnel to shift some of the administrative burden off the pastor. That has resulted in higher expense. Attendance at mass is down and that continues to impact the weekly collections (see graph above).
