Unit 6 | Jesus Calls the First Disciples
New International Version (NIV) |
Mark 1:16—20, 2:13—17, 3:13—19

### Introduction

Jesus could have called anyone to serve along side Him in His life saving mission. He could have called synagogue leaders. He could have

called Pharisees, Sadducees or Scribes. He could have called political leaders. But, when the time came for Jesus to begin His public ministry, He called upon fishermen, a tax collector, common working men of Galilee to respond to the call: "Come and Follow Men." Called from boat, booths, and from various endeavors, the first disciples witnessed Jesus' miraculous healings and mind-opening teaching; and when it was time for Jesus' ministry to expand and to move towards Jerusalem, He chose twelve apostles to accompany Him. These men would watch and learn of Him and in time they show others how to perform even greater works in Jesus's name! (John 14:12—14) As you enter into this lesson listen to Jesus's call to Peter, Andrew, James and John and ask yourself how you would respond to the invitation. As you read about Jesus's appointment of the twelve apostles, imagine the amazing responsibility that they must have felt—called to go with Jesus, sent out by Jesus, and authorized by Jesus to cast out demons. What has Jesus called, sent and authorized us to do in the world today? Will you answer the call: "Come and Follow Me?"

### Scripture - Mark 1:16-20

Jesus Calls His First Disciples

<sup>16</sup> As Jesus walked beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. <sup>17</sup> "Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will send you out to fish for people." <sup>18</sup> At once they left their nets and followed him.

<sup>19</sup> When he had gone a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John in a boat, preparing their nets. <sup>20</sup> Without delay he called them, and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men and followed him.

### Mark 2:13—17— Jesus Calls Levi and Eats With Sinners

- <sup>13</sup> Once again Jesus went out beside the lake. A large crowd came to him, and he began to teach them. <sup>14</sup> As he walked along, he saw Levi son of Alphaeus sitting at the tax collector's booth. "Follow me," Jesus told him, and Levi got up and followed him.
- <sup>15</sup> While Jesus was having dinner at Levi's house, many tax collectors and sinners were eating with him and his disciples, for there were many who followed him. <sup>16</sup> When the teachers of the law who were Pharisees saw him eating with the sinners and tax collectors, they asked his disciples: "Why does he eat with tax collectors and sinners?"
- <sup>17</sup> On hearing this, Jesus said to them, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners."

### Mark 3:13—19—Jesus Appoints the Twelve

<sup>13</sup> Jesus went up on a mountainside and called to him those he wanted, and they came to him. <sup>14</sup> He appointed twelve that they might be with him and that he might send them out to preach <sup>15</sup> and to have authority to drive out demons. <sup>16</sup> These are the twelve he appointed: Simon (to whom he gave the name Peter), <sup>17</sup> James son of Zebedee and his brother John (to them he gave the name Boanerges, which means "sons of thunder"), <sup>18</sup> Andrew, Philip, Bartholomew, Matthew, Thomas, James son of Alphaeus, Thaddaeus, Simon the Zealot <sup>19</sup> and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.

### **Questions for Meditation:**

- 1) What were the first disciples called to do? (Mark 1:16—20, Matthew 4:18—22) What does it mean to be a fisher of men and women?
- 2) What did the Pharisees call some of Jesus's disciples? And why? What was Jesus's response? And what does Jesus's response mean to you? (See Mark 2:13—15, Luke 16:5, Luke 18:9, Romans 3:23)
- 3) Why did Jesus select 12 Apostles from the group of disciples? Why as the number 12 so important?
- 4) Extra Credit: Why were Jams and John called "Sons of Thunder"?







