**Audrey Sopko** doesn't normally suggest that financial advice be offered in our newsletter, but the following information may prove to be too good to be true.

The government has a 30-year bond program that is tied to inflation. In February the interest rate on these bonds was 7%. Because of rising inflation, as of May, it is over 9%. And being a government program, it is as secure as cash can be. One must keep the bond for at least a year. After that, the penalty to cash in the bond is one quarter's interest rate (so if you have \$10k for a year and cash it in, the penalty is \$240).

Here is the website for inflation-driven government bonds.

Individual - Series I Savings Bonds (treasurydirect.gov)


As you can see in the highlighted red box, current interest rate is 9.62% until October 2022.

Just click on the underlined word "buy" to purchase a bond. I think you can buy one for as little as \$25, but the maximum the government allows is \$10,000.

Your financial advisor will not be able to buy them for you. They must be purchased through the website. Still, talk to him/her so that you feel comfortable making the purchase.
