Lick Skillet Recipe Corner

Breakfast Bread Pudding with Berry Sauce

3 eggs 1-1/4 cups sugar 5 cups low fat milk 1-1/2 cups half & half 1-1/2 stick unsalted butter, melted 1-1/2 Tbsp vanilla extract 1-1/4 cups raisins 1-1/2 tsp nutmeg 1-1/2 french baguette sliced into ½ inch slices

Vegetable spray Powdered sugar Mixed Berry Sauce

Preheat oven to 350°. Combine all ingredients except baguette slices and whisk to blend. Place bread slices in large bowl, pouring mixture over bread. Let stand, turning bread as needed until bread is soft and saturated, about 20 minutes. Arrange bread in sprayed 4-quart baking dish (no more than 2-3 inches in depth). Pour mix over bread. Bake for 45-50 minutes, or until custard is set and lightly browned. Pour warm berry sauce over bread pudding and sprinkle with powdered sugar.

Berry Sauce

4 cups mixed berries (raspberries, strawberries, blueberries, etc)
1/3 cup orange juice
1/4-/1/3 cup sugar to taste (should be slightly tart)
3 Tbsp fresh lemon juice

Mix all ingredients in large saucepan over medium heat. Cook until berries break apart, about 5 minutes. Simmer 10-15 minutes stirring occasionally. Serve warm over bread pudding.

Educational Corner – **Partial Seaming** can be a tricky step in having a block where the seams lay flat and meet in the corners. With these simple steps, you will have a beautiful block that matches up with no bumps in the middle from your layered fabric.







Partial Seaming

Partial seaming is a technique used when there are a variety of unevenly placed blocks/sections in a quilt.

- A On design surface, lay out quilt sections around square (photo A).
- B Stitch first seam as shown, starting approximately 2" (dot) from top left corner of center square (photo B).
- C Open out square and press partial seam (**photo C**), creating an edge that is the same length as the third section.
- **D, E** Working counterclockwise, sew third section (green; **photo D**) and fourth section (red; **photo E**) Open and press.
- **F** In same manner, add fifth section (yellow; **photo F**). To complete assembly, begin by lowering the needle at the end of the partial seam.
- **G** Backstitch one or two stitches and sew from this point to the edges of the first and fifth sections (**photo G**).
