A NAPFA win -- NSW Government to look at fossicking in National Parks.

Good News!

On 6 March the NSW Parliament tabled its Committee Inquiry report on 'Tourism in local communities' (we covered in the last NAPFA News).

NAPFA, along with other individual fossickers, made submissions to this inquiry which highlighted the potential of fossicking tourism and our problems with access. We also attended public hearings.

The good news for all fossickers in NSW is in the recommendations:

Recommendation 17

That the NSW Government investigate further opportunities for tourism development in national parks including accommodation, camping, mountain bike trails and fossicking.

Recommendation 19

That the NSW Government investigate opportunities for fossicking in national parks, a single access fee for state forests and linking information for fossicking activities on the Destination NSW website.

The report is available on www.parliament.nsw.gov.au/gpsc3 along with submissions, transcripts of evidence and other documents associated with the Inquiry.

For details on the fossicking content go to page 106 to 109 in Chapter 6.

The report and its 25 recommendations are now with the Government for consideration. The Government is required to respond to the recommendations within six months.

NAPFA will offer any support requested to the Government while it considers these recommendations.

There is no guarantee that we will get access to any of these national park areas, however we have stated our case and it has been at least noticed.

The single licence for State Forests is already in the pipeline and its release is imminent, so we can consider that one done.

Positive Meeting with Tourism Minister

On 6th March NAPFA had a meeting with the NSW Tourism Minister, the Hon George Souris.

During the meeting we

- Provided an overview of fossicking and its connection to tourism
- Proposed a NSW Gold Fields Tourist Route in the Bathurst Basin that would rival the Gold Fields Trail in Victoria's Golden Triangle
- Discussed the need for formal Destination NSW research on the value of fossicking in regional communities
- Briefed on Outdoor Press's progress with a NSW Gold and Gem Atlas by Doug Stone
- Sought his support for proposed fossicking areas in Kosciuszko National Park and for a general access to Sturt National Park near Tibooburra
- Discussed ways that Visitor Information Centres could be more responsive to fossicking needs.

There is a lot of follow-up work to do from the meeting including putting forward a detailed concept for the Gold Fields Tourist Route and a brief for research. We'll keep you up to date in due course. It was a good meeting though and NAPFA thanks the Minister for his time and interest in meeting with us.

NAPFA representatives were: Stephen Dangaard, President; Doug and Julie Stone, NAPFA members and Proprietors of Outdoor Press.

The meeting was also attended by the Hon. Robert Brown, MLC, Shooters and Fishers Party, who set the meeting up for us.

Crookwell Reserves Update

National Parks are still working on the new Plan of Management for the Crookwell Reserves. These cover about 2800 ha of prospecting ground around Tuena. Maybe we will have a result in a few months but with constantly slipping deadlines it could be another six months!

It is presently being prepared for the relevant Advisory Council which has required the chasing-up of more information about its fossicking history and the potential impacts of fossicking and how they could be managed.

The fact that it has required more information is encouraging but it is still unwise to predict the outcome to the whole process at this stage, so I won't try!

In my opinion the hoops that are required under the Plan of Management process demonstrate the strong bias towards 'protection' in the system and result in SCA's being managed as National Parks when that was never the intention of that class of reserve.

If you have a change to talk to Members of the NSW Parliament about your hobby and these issues, then please do so. The only way that such bias can ultimately be overcome is through political action.

You can be sure that Protectionist Greenies will be presenting doomsday scenarios if fossickers are allowed anywhere. Wasn't it Hanrahan that said: "We'll all be rooned!"?.

I hope some common sense prevails.

Background

The area used to be available for fossicking, as it is Crown Land, but this right was extinguished <u>unilaterally</u> by NPWS in 2010 in order to expand the protected areas under the Goulburn Comprehensive Regional Assessment.

Since that time it has been illegal to fossick in those reserve areas even though fossicking has traditionally occurred there.

Fossickers lodged almost 20 individual submissions as well, and the matter was discussed via internet forums. Since the submissions closed in February last year, NPWS has been evaluating them and considering them as they develop a draft Plan of Management. The long delay has occurred due to change of responsibility in NPWS, bushfires and bureaucracy.

Voluntary Contributions


Through his show work, where he introduces panning to newbies, Martin is a true NAPFA ambassador. He talks to people about us, and gives them Membership forms as well.

Committee meets NPWS at Copeland Tops to look at the SCA there

At the beginning of February the NAPFA committee went to Gloucester to inspect the Copeland Tops SCA in preparation for our submission when it comes up.

When we were there we met with the local NPWS Ranger and the District Manager to discuss our intentions to put in a submission in due course.

The area used to be a major gold producer area but has been locked-up to fossickers even though it remains in theory available to mining.

NPWS uses the SCA and the Mountain Maid mine as an education centre for school groups. There are excellent facilities, built at considerable cost, and the kids learn about the gold history of the area and try their hand at panning in plastic tubs (unable to go in the gold bearing creek because of liability concerns).

The SCA is quite rugged and if we are able to get access there would require a good degree of fitness to be able to move through the terrain.
