
BREAST CANCER IDAHO 2018

Early detection is the key to breast cancer survival.

Idaho Goal: 81% screening rate by 2020



Women that are current on screening.

> Idaho **65%**

U.S. **78**%

Public Health Districts 1, 5 and 6 have a lower screening rate than the state overall.

Breast cancer screening rates decreased from 2014 to 2016



Screening Guidelines

Mammograms starting no later than age 50 and at least every 2 years up to age 74.

Idaho ranks

in the nation for screening

(Includes DC & Puerto Rico)

of new cases of invasive breast cancer were diagnosed at a late stage in 2017

deaths from breast cancer in 2017

of Idaho women will **survive** at least 5 years after diagnosis


Priority Populations

Greatest impact on screening rates can be made by focusing on:

- Women age 50-64
- Women with health insurance
- **Hispanic and American Indian/** Alaska Native women

Late stage diagnosis are more frequent among women who are rarely or never screened for breast cancer.

Late Stage Incidence 2016



Public Health Districts 1, 2, 6, and 7 have higher incidence rates of late stage breast cancer than the state overall.
