VISION CHECK-UP

I got new glasses a few months back...trifocals (I am officially old!). I was surprised my vision had not changed too much since my last vision check-up, but it did change some. As far as our human eyes are concerned (for most of us anyway), vision changes over time are Inevitable. As far as human social institutions (including the Church) are concerned, changes of vision are not inevitable—they may be sorely needed, even critical for adaptability and survival—but they are not inevitable. For an institution to grow and remain relevant to its purpose (to renew and strengthen its purpose) a change of vision must be chosen...it must be intentional. Here at SPUCC we intentionally chose to do the New Beginnings process starting in 2018. We chose to do a vision check-up for our church. It took over a year, and last fall we launched into a time of embracing a new "future story." As a much-needed reminder, here are the key pieces of that new story...

Our VISION STATEMENT – ABC: Accept, Bless, Connect

To Accept: welcome, include, and embrace with open arms

To Bless: love, affirm, serve, and enrich

To Connect: unifying, networking, bridging, binding

Our MISSION STATEMENT: Accept all into our fellowship with the love of God!

Bless all through service as Christ commands!

Connect with our neighbors in meaningful, relevant ways!

Our CORE VALUES: Spirituality, Mission Love, Community

Late last fall, we invited members of the Vision Team and the church Council to begin a <u>strategic planning process</u>...to start "putting wheels" on our future story and make our new vision/mission start to come alive. It was a small group, but we did get started, with the first task being to <u>identify and prioritize</u> all the steps we need to take, and all the <u>ministries we need to let go of or to begin</u> (or revamp and improve).

Then, 2020 rolled around. This important, difficult, and time-consuming work came to a grinding halt, for numerous reasons, both pandemic-related and otherwise (internal conflict, major changes in the Nursery School—which is now the Early Learning Center—and of course, the Covid-19 "lockdown"). Late this summer, the SPUCC Council and Executive Team took up the task of strategic planning again, knowing we must push forward without dwelling on the past, working with what we have. We jump started strategic planning, trusting in both God and the congregation to come through with birthing our future story: trusting God to guide us and empower us, and the congregation to grow spiritually and in depth of discipleship...all so that we can hear and respond to what God is doing!

Of course, we have lots more work to do...A copy of the work on the strategic planning process—as it currently stands—is available posted on the bulletin board in the Café. The <u>current</u> phase of this process is reviewing and updating all of our church policies, our teams and committees, (and ultimately our by-laws), so that we are practicing good stewardship of our current resources, but

also enabling our new vision/mission...to make sure that we are really trying to make it a reality.

To that end, we ask for help. We need volunteers to step up in these areas: Sunday School, SPY leaders (especially adult males!), Greeters and Ushers, Worship leaders, special music for worship, and interim leaders (until next June) for the Finance team, the Worship team, the Care/Mission team, and a forthcoming Communications and Technology team. Help in other areas will be needed too, as our strategic planning deepens and unfolds. And, even if you cannot help in any of these areas, you can do two important things right now for our future story: first, we must ALL choose again our vision check-up. We have to TRUST the vison and TRUST God ... and let go of the past and embrace the future as it unfolds. So much is unpredictable right now that we HAVE to trust God's vision—that God will bless our vision check-up! With all the anxiety and uncertainty and shifting ground everywhere we look these days, faithful disciples will trust that God will use this time for renewal and rebirth...after all, RESURRECTION is a thing with God! It's not the end of the world but the birth of a new one.

Second, pray a lot more—for God to deepen you and your personal discipleship, to guide our leaders with clarity and certainty, and to grant us all increased hope and inspiration...even (especially!) in a time when those feel like they are in short supply. They are not. Not really...but it takes a reliance on God's vision to discern that... and faith enough to trust that God is still at work and always has been in giving us a new future story!

FROM THE ENDOWMENT COMMITTEE

First I hope you all are well and safe. I think we all aware of the "19" that has thrown us all into a day to day turmoil. I wanted to bring you up to date on our Endowment Funds.

The first four months covering January, February, March and April. Church Endowment Fund in January was \$171,437.67 and it was \$164,235.51 in April. This was a loss of \$7202.16. The Church Vocational Fund in January was \$49,507.04 and in April it was \$47,946.11 a loss of \$1560.93 Our loss for the first four months was \$8763.09. However, even with a loss in the first four months we had a gain of \$1002.00.

In the last four months of our progress May, June, July and August, Church Endowment Fund in May was \$167,728.37. In August it was \$175,404.15 this was a gain of \$7675.78 for four months. The Church Vocation Fund in May was \$48,895.16 in August and it was \$50,984.62. This was a gain of \$2089.52. Our total gain for these four months was \$9765.30.

I am sure you all remember how the Stock Market reacts during an election year in that everyone of the stock investors are guessing as to what is going to happen. As usual if you follow the Stock Market as I do, it has ups and downs daily. We in general are holding our own at this point in time. I sincerely hope God Willing we will go back to a somewhat normal life soon. To all please stay Safe and Healthy.



Bible. SIGN-UP SHEETS are located in the Narthex and in the Café.


