The design for this card is taken from an 1889 pattern that was most probably a supplement to a French lady's magazine. ( *Conseiller des dames et des demoiselles* – 1<sup>st</sup> January 1889 )

The little rhyme is taken from the Hill's Manual, also from 1889



**Design Area:** 7,75" x 5,50" (124 x 88 stitches)
