10th Grade Mini-Course Descriptions for 2022-2023

Fall/Winter 2022

Session 1: Answering God's Call – What is a Vocation

Teens spend lots of time thinking about what they want to "do" and "be". Success is often defined through a specific college, work, or career path, but understanding your vocation – your calling from God - is much deeper and is designed to lead a person toward holiness. This mini-course will introduce youth to the Church teachings on Vocations.

Session 2: Sacraments of Initiation

This course will look at Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation by discussing the meaning of various signs and symbols utilized in each of these Sacraments. The goal of this course is to connect the three Sacraments of Initiation to better prepare the participants to enter the Confirmation Preparation Program in their junior year.

Session 3: Waiting, Watching, Wondering

In our instant gratification/"Google it" world, many teens don't have a lot of experience with waiting for things. This Advent themed minicourse will guide teens into and through the Season of Advent with a mix of hands-on activities and practical suggestions how a young person can wait, watch, and wonder to grow deeper in their faith as the birth of Jesus approaches.

Session 4: Becoming Peacemakers

This mini course will encourage participants to think about the presence or absence of peace within themselves, in their relationships, in society and in the world. Using the life and message of Jesus as an example, participants will be challenged to explore constructive ways to resolve conflict and bring about peace in their world and the world.

<u>Session 5: Wonder & Awe –</u> <u>God's Creation Surrounds</u>

This mini-course hopes to give participants a deeper appreciation for the Wonder & Awe of God's Creation. Participants will be immersed in the nature that surrounds the parish grounds by going outside for a portion of each session. Youth will learn that our faith calls us to act and advocate to protect all that God has created and be challenged to consider how they can make a positive environmental impact.

*Note – participants should be prepared to go OUTSIDE for a portion of each session

Session 6: Divine Mercy

This mini course will explore what Mercy means and how "focusing on the experience of the love of God who consoles, pardons, and instills hope" (Pope Francis) can impact us as individuals and the entire world.
