We will also continue to go over what sounds "r" makes when it is with a vowel. Such as /ar/, /or/, /er/, /ir/, and /ur/. Homework will consist of these blends and how they are used in words. Please review with your child at home. My class will also be looking at words and working on replacing one letter to make a new word. In math we will be working on addition and subtraction story problems. Students continue to go over nouns and verbs. We will read short sentences as a class and students will be asked to identify these. Let's have a great week! - Miss Rachel

1st/2nd: We have a short week this week so we will be working hard while we're here. Both grades will have a spelling test on Thursday. First grade is working on reading to understand the author's purpose this week. We are also discussing land and water in science. First grade needs to be practicing their math facts and sight words daily. Second grade will continue working on reading comprehension this week with a couple new stories. Second grade is also working on telling time to the exact minute. We will be working on identifying natural resources and erosion in science and practicing identifying our new states. Second grade will have a states quiz on Wednesday. - Mrs. Hird

3rd/4th: With the end of March coming this week, our class has been diligently working to prepare for the MAP tests. We've been focusing on reading and comprehension which we will continue to do but also this week, we are moving into preparing for the math portions of the tests. Both grades will have a Social Studies test on Tuesday. Students should have brought home the short questions over the weekend to study. Third grade will have a Science test over chapter 12 on Tuesday, April 6th and fourth grade will have one over chapter 11 that day as well. – **Mrs. Cooper**

5th/6th: 5th science students have a test over Chp 13 April 7. 6th grade is working on Chp. 1 in their book on Environmental Science. Both classes are working on grammar mechanics. In Social Studies 5th grade is finishing Chp 3, Background to the Conflict. 6th grade is finishing Egypt. 5/6th grades are working to complete Buckledown reading and C.A.R.S. **7/8th:** 7/8 Comm. Art students are reading different literature selections aloud in class and having brief discussions. Mrs. Foster wants the classes to continue working in Buckledown reading/12 questions, as well as in C.A.R.S until those two books are finished. - **Mrs. Sewell**

5th-8th Math: Fifth grade is continuing with operations involving fractions and transformations. Sixth grade is continuing with the nature of proportions and looking at the fundamental steps of equations. Seventh grade is continuing with operations involving algebraic terms and unit multipliers. In pre-algebra, students are working with angle measures and harder order-of-operations problems involving negative signs and exponents. In algebra, students are continuing to look at the different types of problems involving functions and polynomial division. **Tests This Week:** 5th and 6th Math: Tuesday, Pre-Algebra: Wednesday **7th-8th:** We are again between science concepts and will be taking some time in the health series. In social studies, seventh grade is continuing with a chapter on efforts at imperialism in the 19th century. Eighth grade continues heading towards the U. S. Civil War. In grammar, seventh grade is finishing up a unit on prepositional phrases. Eighth grade is learning about the verbals. **Tests Next Week:** 7th and 8th Social Studies: Wednesday - **Mr. Ewing**
