For each UFO listed on your form that is completed and shown at a show and tell, you will be given a ticket to enter a drawing for prizes, which will be held at the end of the year.



Ugly Fabric Swap Challenge – It's FUN and UGLY and will bring the quilt police to tears!!!

At the February meeting we discussed doing an "UGLY" Fabric Swap challenge. This is one area of interest that was popular in the surveys that we received! Sooo, here goes!!

Those who want to participate will bring in 2 yards of ugly fabric (minimum of 4 different fabrics), for example: Horrendously ugly High contrast, hard to use Really busy Boring, boring Past its sell date (How long have you had it?) Stuff you just plain don't like Leftover novel fabric

It will be put in a brown paper bag (which will be provided). You can bring your fabric to any meeting between now and May. The May meeting is the cutoff to participate, at which time we will number the bags and each participant will draw for their ugly quilt fabric.

Choose any pattern you want to make your quilt but you must use 90% of the ugly fabric you received in your bag. You are allowed to add enough of your own fabric to make the quilt measure 40" square! You will have from May to September to complete your quilt. The quilts will be brought to the September meeting and who knows what we'll have in store then!

Get ready, get set, now, go play!!!!

Lick Skillet Recipe Corner

Italian Garden Frittata

6 egg white

4 eggs

½ cup grated Romano cheese, divided
1 Tbsp minced fresh sage
½ tsp salt
¼ tsp pepper
1 small zucchini, sliced
2 green onions, sliced
1 tsp olive oil
2 plum tomatoes, thinly sliced

In a large bowl, whisk egg whites, eggs, ¼ cup Romano cheese, sage, salt and pepper; set aside. In a 10-inch ovenproof skillet coated with cooking spray, sauté zucchini and onions in oil for 2 minutes. Add egg mixture; cover and cook for 4-6 minutes or until eggs are nearly set. Uncover, top with tomato slices and remaining cheese. Broil 3-4 inches from the heat for 2-3 minutes or until eggs are completely set. Let stand for 5 minutes. Cut into wedges. Yield 4 servings.
