

East Alabama Horseman’s Association (EAHA) Awards


How to Qualify for Individual Class Awards

- 1) Join at least one East Alabama Horseman’s Association member club: Alexander City Horse Riding Club, EAHA Youth Club, Tri County Riding Club and/or Whistle Stop Ranch Riding Club. The shows and points do not count toward EAHA awards or State Show qualification until a member club is joined. (NOTE: Join all member clubs that you want to try for that club’s year-end awards.)
- 2) Obtain a copy of the **2022 East Alabama Horseman’s Association Rules** and the **2022 EAHA Mandatory Classes** information and read them. These items are found on the website at: <https://achrc.com/rules>. If you have any questions, contact the EAHA President, Keith Dean or email: achrcmail@gmail.com.
- 3) In the EAHA Mandatory Classes list, find the classes that you want to show in that award a highpoint and reserve award. These classes will also be noted on each club’s showbill with an “E”.
- 4) Show the same horse in the same mandatory (“E”) class in at least eight (8) shows for the points from that class to count toward highpoint in that class.
- 5) At least one (1) of the eight (8) shows must be an EAHA Fundraiser horse show.

There are 17 horse shows in the 2022 EAHA regular show season: <https://achrc.com/horse-shows>.

- ALL 17 shows count toward EAHA “Mandatory Class” awards. (The more shows you ride in your mandatory class, the more chances for points.)
- Two (2) of the 17 shows are EAHA Fundraiser shows (4/2/2022 & 8/6/2022) – put those on your calendar and try to show in at least one if not both of those shows; as the money raised at those two shows go toward year end awards.

An example of what points will and will not count:

*Points from this class will not be counted toward that mandatory class’ awards because they did not meet the “number of shows” (8) criteria. (However, if it is a State Show class they would qualify for the State show if they are in the top 20 in points because the 2022 State Show qualification is 6 shows.)
