During this entire year of 2020, the Good Neighbor and Information Center has been extremely busy serving in a mission in the church and community. Here is a brief summary of what's been happening recently:

During the past month, Good Neighbor has served more than 100 individuals and families. This includes:

- Providing the Centra Mammography Unit at GH for the 9th consecutive year serving 12 individuals
- Delivering pies to the homes of 15 shut-ins or at-home members
- Sponsoring monthly lunches to the staff of the GHELC of approximately 20
- Proving lunch to workers at the local Habitat house for approximately 15
- Maintaining regular outreach through the Friday Friends program to 5-10 individuals
- Teaming with the Missions Committee to provide Christmas for Jamie Davis' class at APS with party items and gift bags for 10 children
- Distributing the hygiene bags from the children's mission group to 4 schools
- Assisting with personal support to more than 25 individuals and families in need through food, financial responses to emergencies or unexpected health and household situations, referrals to services, and maintaining contact with 3 families on an ongoing basis.
- Meeting with a new family experiencing change and considering moving to Appomattox.

We thank the GH Good Neighbor Team and the Grace Hills Baptist Church Family for their work and ongoing commitment to this mission. What happens as a result is often something we cannot put into numbers. Many of these families and individuals look to Grace Hills as the church that shows Christian caring and as the people who truly love them unconditionally.
