Pine Valley Site

The Pine Valley site is located northwest of the town of Pine Valley, next to the Santa Clara River, at the entrance to a large canyon – Figure 1. This a rather ideal location, a water source and cool temperatures in the spring through the fall. There are a number of very large boulders that looked to have formed rock shelters – Figure 2.

The site consists of one large panel, Figure 3, and a smaller side panel, Figure 4. Figures 5 through 10. show details of the panels.

The glyphs are unique in that the symbols are not typical for the area – for example there are no obvious anthros or zoo morphs. There are no spirals, circles or other common images. Rather the images are a series of lines, some parallel and some intersecting.

Figure 6 is an image that shows a reflection consisting of three parallel, hemispherical lines.

The other neighboring sites in the Central Utah area have a Fremont "flair", however this site does not.


