President's Preamble

Daylight is getting longer, yet the weather keeps one guessing in true Melbourne style and hopefully for the snow lovers it continues to be cold and lots of that white stuff falls; just remember that spring is just around the corner. Hopefully all the shrub pruning has been done.

Around Town

Here are some of the things that we are following up with the Shire:

- The Car Park/Peninsula Link signage in the median strip adjacent to Dennis Street is set too low which is a safety issue, as one can't see on-coming traffic when executing 'U" turns across the openings in the median.
- The "Packing House" sign which mysteriously was relocated from near the traffic lights to the nature strip just before the United service station needs to be put back. It is confusing for tourists who follow the sign and turn into Dalton Drive.
- The unmade access drive to Bunguyan Reserve from the kindergarten needs to be sealed; bearing in min that the new changing rooms complex is almost finished, which means the traffic flow will be on the rise.
- With the commencement of the Friends of Oliver's Creek group, wouldn't it be a great idea to see them, in conjunction with Vic Roads, the Education Department and Tyabb Primary School, create a car park on the western end of the school oval. This would go a long way to alleviating the chaos at drop off and pick up times and more importantly make it safe for all road users.
- Due to the increase in traffic in both direction on Mornington-Tyabb Road, especially between the traffic lights and the Boes/Jones Road roundabout, one area that creates some angst is the entry to the Packing House. This is particularly so when heading west and getting stuck behind people waiting to turn right and the traffic backs up across the railway line. What we think is needed is a dedicated right turning lane, however when looking at the surroundings this may not be possible; so please take care and consider other motorists. We will ask some questions of various authorities as to whether this can be addressed.

Tyabb Airfield

Over recent weeks there has been a considerable amount of ill-informed and inflammatory commentary about the attitude of the Tyabb & District Ratepayers Group regarding the Tyabb airfield. To dispel this misinformation, I can state authoritatively that the position of the Ratepayers Group has always been, and continues to be, to support the Council in its stated intention when it implemented the Tyabb Airfield and Environs Review in 2004, viz.:

To identify policies, strategies and controls for the Tyabb Airfield to ensure the long term retention and operation of the airfield in a manner that is accepted and supported by the local community

Consequently the Ratepayers Group also enthusiastically endorses the conclusion of the 2017 Tyabb Airfield Precinct Plan (TAPP), viz.:

The long-term sustainability of airfield operations is intrinsically linked to maintaining the amenity of the area. The TAPP aims to provide the foundations to achieve a **"balanced, fair and sustainable co-existence"**

between airfield operations and the amenity of the local community

Claims to the contrary are without substance, deceptive and so should be disregarded.

The New Friends of Oliver's Creek Bushland Reserve Off To A Flying Start

As announced in the last Ratepayers newsletter, a new Friends Group has been formed to help improve the 15 hectare Oliver's Creek Bushland Reserve in Tyabb. A mixture of locals who had grown up with the Reserve and newcomers to the district who were intrigued to discover the Reserve's hidden mysteries attended the inaugural meeting on site on Sunday, 21st July.

The volunteers were welcomed by Watson Ward Councillor Julie Morris and members of the Shire's Natural Systems team led by Volunteer Officer Hannah Brown. They emphasised the crucial contribution that volunteers make to rehabilitating and maintaining Reserves across the Shire.





Bathed in late-Winter sunshine, hopefully an omen for working bees to come, the volunteers explored the extensive reserve. Insights into the history of the area and some its secrets were shared by a number of locals. This included the remains of the old Scout Camp Farnie, as well as a traditional Aboriginal watering hole, which

is spring fed, providing water all year round.

During the tour there was a great deal of reminiscing about childhood adventures in the Reserve and enthusiastic chatter about removing Pittosporums, nightshades and Bridal Creeper; all to be targets for future weeding operations. As a result an outline of a Friends Group working plan was sketched out and will be integrated with the Shire's plans by the Natural System team.

The coordinator of the Friends Group will be Oliver's Creek local Yashmin

Beaumont. The Friends agreed to meet for a Working Bee once every two months on the second Saturday of every odd numbered month. The first Working Bee will be on Saturday, 14th September from 10:00am to noon. Meeting point will be the entrance off Wellington Road.



With such an enthusiastic start from a couple of dozen prospective Friends, it would be great to see even more new Friends at the first Working Bee. No experience required and all tools and equipment is provided by the Shire, including coffee and biscuits!
