Please note the position of Ring Bearer and Flower Girl can change depending on their age and their relationship to other's who may be in the procession.

If the Groom's men are going to accompany the Bride's Maid during the procession, each Groom's man will be assigned a Bride's Maid to accompany down the aisle and will be to the right of the Bride's Maid as they walk up the aisle.

The Father of the Bride walks to the Bride's right as going up the aisle. This tradition developed when Men protected women and carried their swords on their right and need the right arm (traditionally the dominant arm) would be free to use the sword if necessary to provide protection.

The following are sample ceremonies and are intended to give you an idea of what your ceremony could look like. Rev. Bob will work with you to create a ceremony that is personal to you. There are three things that Rev. Bob looks for when working with you to create your ceremony. Rev. Bob: Marriage is a new burden and responsibility to provide and care for the family. Marriage involves a commitment to provide and protect. The persons involved must realize this responsibility before entering into the state of matrimony. The word warns those who fail to take care of their family.

NEW BRIGHTNESS:

Reader: Ecclesiastes.4:9.

"You are better off to have a friend than to be all alone, because then you will get more enjoyment out of what you earn."

Rev. Bob: Two candles can give more light than one. Marriage can produce a new brightness in serving the Lord. The family is called to be a living witness for the Lord. In this world of sin and iniquity. The Lord wants the families of His children to be shining examples of His grace and glory.

NEW BOLDNESS:

Reader: Ecclesiastes.4:12. "And if one can overpower him who is alone, two can resist him. A cord of three strands is not quickly torn apart"

Rev. Bob: Marriage gives security and courage to face life. Mutual encouragement and motivation can give a fresh courage to face the battles of life. A lonely warrior can get easily disheartened and discouraged. Therefore marriage can provide a new courage and boldness in facing life together.

PAUL'S FIRST LETTER TO THE CORINTHIANS 13

And if I have the gift of prophecy and comprehend all mysteries and all knowledge; if I have all faith so as to move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. If I give away everything I own, and if I hand my body over so that I may boast but do not have love, I gain nothing.

Love is patient, love is kind. It is not jealous, love is not pompous, it is not inflated. It is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love does not come to an end.

We know partially and we prophesy partially, but when the perfect comes, the partial will pass away. When I was a child, I used to talk as a child, think as a child, reason as a child; when I became a man, I put aside childish things. At present I know partially; then I shall know fully. Faith, hope and love remain, these three; but the greatest of these is love.

ROMANS CHAPTER 12 VERSES 1-2/9-18

I recommend you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God, your spiritual worship. Do not conform yourselves to this age but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that you may recognize what is the will of God, what is good and pleasing and perfect.

He who is a hired hand, and not a shepherd, who is not the owner of the sheep, sees the wolf coming, and leaves the sheep and flees, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. He flees because he is a hired hand and is not concerned about the sheep. I am the good shepherd, and I know My own and My own know Me, even as the Father knows Me and I know the Father; and I lay down My life for the sheep. I have other sheep, which are not of this fold; I must bring them also, and they will hear My voice; and they will become one flock with one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves Me, because I lay down My life so that I may take it again. No one has taken it away from Me, but I lay it down on My own initiative I have authority to lay it down, and I have authority to take it up again This commandment I received from My Father.

JOHN CHAPTER 15 VERSES 9 – 12

I will give and receive, speak and listen, inspire and respond. I will forgive as we have been forgiven. I will work with you to better understand ourselves, our families and our children. I will remain with you through the best and the worst so that together we may raise a family and serve God as long as we both shall live.

WRITING YOUR OWN VOWS

Writing your own vows can be a very meaningful and loving experience. It is not a task that you want to leave until the last minute as the pressure of the event will usually interfere with vows and it is likely you will abandon the effort or "just throw something together".

I normally suggest to couples that ceremony planning take place about 60 to 90 days before the wedding. At this point any theme for the wedding will have been decided and hopefully the bridal party and wedding professionals will have been selected. How to get started? Well here are some suggestions.

1. In order to get in the right frame of mind I suggest you set aside some time when you will not be interrupted.

2. Take a moment to mediate or pray together asking for inspirations as you begin this task together.

3. It is normally a good idea to review the <u>vows on this site</u> and some books which contain vows. This will give you some ideas as to what you might want to include in your vows.

4. Talk about what marriage means to you. What do you expect from the relationship? What do the words respect, love, commitment and promise mean to you?

5. Think about when you met. When did you say I love you for the first time. What prompted you to say a love you that first time? What did you feel the first time you said or heard those three words?

6. Why did you decide to get married? What does marriage mean to you?

7. What do you have together that you do not have apart?

8. How have you gotten through the difficult times in your relationship so far?

9. Each of you take some separate time and write down what you admire the most in your future spouse.

10. Do you want to write vows separately or do you want mutual vows that you will both say to each other?

11. Once you have completed the discussion, reading and thinking it is time to sit down and write the first draft.

12. The vows should consider the seriousness of the commitment you are about to make to each other but may be clever. You should include a reference to the permanency of your love, commitment and honesty to one another.

13. Vows should be no longer than 90 seconds. Otherwise, they may

be hard to recite on your wedding day when you are nervous.

14. HAVE A GREAT TIME AND WRITE SOME VOWS THAT ARE MEANINGFUL TO YOU. REMEMBER THE KEY IS LOVE.

Ecclesiastes 4:12 reads, "Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves. A cord of three strands is not quickly broken."

ROSE CEREMONY

Your gift to each other for your wedding today has been your wedding rings - which shall always be an outward demonstration of your vows of love and respect; and a public showing of your commitment to each other.

You now have what remains the most honorable title which may exist between a man and a woman - the title of "husband" and "wife." For your first gift as husband and wife, that gift will be a single rose.

In the past, the rose was considered a symbol of love and a single rose always meant only one thing - it meant the words "I love you." So it is appropriate that for your first gift - as husband and wife - that gift would be a single rose.

Please exchange your first gift as husband and wife. In some ways it seems like you have not done anything at all. Just a moment ago you were holding one small rose - and now you are holding one small rose. In some ways, a marriage ceremony is like this. In some ways, tomorrow is going to seem no different than yesterday. But in fact today, just now, you both have given and received one of the most valuable and precious gifts of life - one I hope you always remember - the gift of true and abiding love within the devotion of marriage.

______ and _____, I would ask that where ever you make your home in the future - whether it be a large and elegant home - or a small and graceful one - that you both pick one very special location for roses; so that on each anniversary of this truly wonderful occasion you both may take a rose to that spot both as a recommitment to your marriage - and a recommitment that this will be a marriage based upon love. In every marriage there are times where it is difficult to find the right words. That rose says the words: "I still love you." The other should accept this rose for the words which cannot be found, and remember the love and hope that you both share today.

______ and _____, if there is anything you remember of this marriage ceremony, it is that it was love that brought you here today, it is only love which can make it a glorious union, and it is by love which your marriage shall endure."

JUMPING THE BROOM

The tradition of "Jumping the Broom" has both European and African roots. Early Celtics and West Africans practiced this tradition. It is still practiced in some parts of West Africia today.

Enslaved Africans, as an affirmation of their cultural heritage practiced it during slavery in United States. This "leap" into a new life (marriage life) as husband and wife is performed in the presence of families and friends. The broom has both symbolic and spiritual importance in the African culture.

A special ceremonial broom is used. More information on the ceremonial broom can be found at the link on the www.religiousweddings.org website.

The couple holds the broom together and sweeps in a circle as the officiant or family member talks about the significance of the ritual. Then the broom is placed on the floor, the couple joins hands, everyone counts to three and the couple jumps.

These are the hands that will give you strength and encouragement to help fulfill your dreams. Together as a team, everything you wish for can be realized. These are the hands that will hold you tight and support you as you struggle through difficult times. These are the hand that will comfort you when you are sick, and console you when you are grieving. They are the hands that will passionately love you and cherish you through the years, for a lifetime of happiness.

God blesses these hands that you see before you this day. May they always be held by one another. Give them the strength to hold on during the storms of stress and the dark of disillusionment. Keep them tender and gentle as they nurture each other in wondrous love. Help these hands to continue building a relationship founded in your grace, rich in caring and devoted to reach for your perfections. May ______ and ______ see their four hands together as a healer, protector, shelter and guide.

Release of Doves

For many centuries, the White Dove has been an emblem of the Spirit, Peace, Love and New Beginnings. The releasing of doves raises our eyes up, and fills our hearts with joy, peace and remembrance.

______ and _____, our wish for you is that your life together will be everlasting, rich and rewarding. May your marriage carry with it all the wonderful qualities that the White Doves represent.

Watering A Unity Plant

"Gardenia flowers mean secret love, purity and joy. Beauty and lovely too are words associated with this flower. Prized for its sweet smell, gardenia flowers are also used in wedding celebrations as wedding symbols, because marriage symbolizes love and purity."

And just like the gardenia they are watering, marriage requires constant nurturing and nourishment. As they provide the sun, soil, and water for this gardinia, they will provide the encouragement, trust, and love needed on a daily basis to consciously nurture and nourish their connection to each other.

ETHNIC AND CULTURAL TRADITIONS

Filipino Wedding Traditions

Coin Ceremony

The Priest/Minister then drops 13 pieces of coins (silver or gold) called arras into the Groom's waiting hands, who in turn drops it into the Bride's hands. The Bride then puts her hand above the Groom's then drops the arras into his hands again. The Groom allows the coins to then be dropped into a plate held by an acolyte.

The metal tinkling of the coins being passed from one pair of hands to the other, is a distinctive reminder of the groom's promise to take care of his wife materially. The bride in return, by giving back the coins to his hands, convey that what they both earn become part of each other's. The trickling sound also signifies abundance and success in the couple's joint efforts. The husband gives his material earnings to his wife who manages, saves and invests the money wisely, as basic Filipino tradition dictates.

Veil Ceremony

In the Catholic ceremony, the Priest continues with the nuptial mass until the "Sanctus". When the bell for the Sanctus rings, it is also a signal for the veil sponsors to come up to the altar. In Protestant ceremonies, the Minister explains the veil ceremony to the congregation and this constitutes as the cue for the veil sponsors.

Together, they pin a veil from the groom's shoulders, extending it to cover the bride's head and shoulders. This is symbolic of the groom pledging his strength and protection to his bride - the wife who he promises to take care of, from this day forward.

Cord Ceremony

The Cord Ceremony follows immediately after. The Cord Sponsors come up to where the Bride and Groom are kneeling, and put a *figure of eight* cord over the veils that are on the heads and shoulders of the Bride and Groom. This cord symbolizes unity and infinity - a love together, forever!

Orthodox Traditions

The Crowning

The bride and groom are crowned with thin crowns, or "stefana", which are joined by a white ribbon and have been blessed by the priest. The crowns symbolise the glory and honour that is being bestowed on them by God, and the the ribbon symbolises their unity. The "Koumbaro" then exchanges the crowns between the heads of the couple, three times.

The Common Cup

The crowning is followed by a reading of the Gospel, which tells of the marriage of Cana at Galilee. It was at this wedding that Jesus performed his first miracle, changing water into wine, which was then given to the married couple. Wine is given to the couple and they each drink from it three times.

The Ceremonial Walk

The priest the leads the couple, who are still wearing their "stefana", three times around the altar on their first steps as a married couple. The "Koumbaro" follows close behind the couple holding the "stefana" place.

The Removal of the Crowns

When the Ceremonial Walk has ended, the priest blesses the couple, the crowns are removed and he then separates their previously joined hands with the bible, reminding them that only God can break the union which they have just entered into.
