

Passage Plan

The key to any successful voyage, whether a short fishing trip to a local bay or a leisurely cruise along the French coast, is not just what you do while on board – it's also what you do beforehand while still on dry land.

The tools used for passage planning may have changed in recent years, especially with the introduction of chart plotters and GPS, but the *raison d'être* for such a plan remains the same – the safety of the boat and its crew while at sea. Prudent skippers have always planned their trips but now it is a mandatory requirement under the terms of SOLAS, the International Convention for Safety of Life at Sea.

The code divides effective passage planning into four sections – Assessment (the gathering of all the information relevant to the voyage), Planning (the preparation of the passage plan), Execution (the carrying out of the plan) and Monitoring (checking that the plan is working and making any changes that become necessary).
