THE GATHERING OF GOD'S PEOPLE

GREETING

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**

The service is introduced.

PENITENCE

Christ calls us to share the heavenly banquet of his love with all the saints in earth and heaven.

Let us then confess our sins in penitence and faith, firmly resolved to keep God's commandments and to live in love and peace:

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, we have sinned in thought and word and deed, and in what we have left undone.
We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.
For the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us, that we may walk in newness of life to the glory of your name. Amen.

PROCLAIMING AND RECEIVING THE WORD

THE READING

1 Corinthians 2: 6-13

Reader: A reading from Saint Paul's letter to the Corinthians, chapter two, beginning at verse six.

Among the mature we do speak wisdom, though it is not a wisdom of this age or of the rulers of this age, who are doomed to perish. But we speak God's wisdom, secret and hidden, which God decreed before the ages for our glory. None of the rulers of this age understood this; for if they had, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory. But, as it is written,

'What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the human heart conceived, what God has prepared for those who love him'—

these things God has revealed to us through the Spirit; for the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God. For what human being knows what is truly human except the human spirit that is within? So also no one comprehends what is truly God's except the Spirit of God. Now we have received not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit that is from God, so that we may understand the gifts bestowed on us by God. And we speak of these things in words not taught by human wisdom but taught by the Spirit, interpreting spiritual things to those who are spiritual.

Reader: This is the word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

PSALM 34: 11-17 is sung

- II. Come, my children, and listen to me; I will teach you the fear of the Lord.
- 12. Who is there who delights in life and longs for days to enjoy good things?
- Keep your tongue from evil and your lips from lying words.
- 14. Turn from evil and do good; seek peace and pursue it.
- 15. The eyes of the Lord are upon the righteous and his ears are open to their cry.
- 16. The face of the Lord is against those who do evil, to root out the remembrance of them from the earth.
- 17. The righteous cry and the Lord hears them and delivers them out of all their troubles.

Reader: Hear the Gospel of our Saviour Christ according to Saint John,

chapter sixteen, beginning at verse twelve.

All: Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

Jesus said: 'I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. All that the Father has is mine. For this reason I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you.'

Reader: This is the Gospel of the Lord.

All: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Father, almighty and everliving God, at all times and in all places it is right to give you thanks and praise.

To this land you sent the glorious gospel through the preaching of Patrick. You caused it to grow and flourish in the life of your servant Saint Fin Barre and in the lives of men and women filled with your Holy Spirit, building up your Church to send forth the good news to other places:

And so with all your people, with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and singing:

Blessed are you, Father, the creator and sustainer of all things; you made us in your own image, male and female you created us; even when we turned away from you, you never ceased to care for us, but in your love and mercy you freed us from the slavery of sin; giving your only begotten Son to become man and suffer death on the cross to redeem us; he made there the one complete and all-sufficient sacrifice for the sins of the whole world: he instituted. and in his holy Gospel commanded us to continue, a perpetual memory of his precious death until he comes again:

On the night that he was betrayed he took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup; and when he had given thanks to you, he gave it to them, saying, Drink this, all of you, for this is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Therefore, Father, with this bread and this cup we do as Christ your Son commanded: we remember his passion and death, we celebrate his resurrection and ascension, and we look for the coming of his kingdom.

Accept through him, our great high priest, this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; and as we eat and drink these holy gifts, grant by the power of the life-giving Spirit that we may be made one in your holy Church and partakers of the body and blood of your Son, that he may dwell in us and we in him;

Through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom, and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, Almighty Father, for ever and ever. Amen.

For the King of kings and Lord of lords, Christ our God, cometh forth to be our oblation and to be given for Food to the faithful. Before him come the choirs of angels with every principality and power; the Cherubim with many eyes, and winged Seraphim, who veil their faces as they shout exultingly the hymn: Alleluia.
