CHAPTER STUDENTS PREPARE FOR MUSIC EDUCATION AUDITIONS

The time is fast approaching for this year's music education auditions. The dates are February 13 and March 13. The evaluations will begin in the morning and run into the afternoon at the Fine Arts Building (or Music Building) on the campus of

Carnegie Mellon University. It will be held in the lower level, basement Room A-2. Adjudicators this year will be Rodrigo Ojeda, keyboard artist with the Pittsburgh Symphony, and Elizabeth Heath Charles, conductor of the Butler Symphony.

The Audition and Evaluation Program of the AHS was started in 1969 by Lucien Thompson. Two performance times are held one month apart in front of two adjudicators who have comment sheets provided by the AHS. Students are given comments based upon their tone, interpretation, memory, rhythm, and stage presence. Each student will have 10 minutes to perform two pieces of contrasting style and then will have 5 minutes to speak with the adjudicators. Etudes are also acceptable. Students are encouraged to use the comments they receive in February, as well as comments from their individual harp teachers, to improve their performance for the second evaluation in March. Students must bring copies of their music for



each of the judges for every session. Also, students should bring the original comments they received from the adjudicators to the second session so that the adjudicators will have a basis for comparison. A third piece may be added to the second session. Students are encouraged to stay and listen to as many other participants as possible during both auditions. The focus of the program is on IMPROVEMENT that can be made by participating on both days. This is not a competition, and there are no prizes awarded. Participants come specifically to be heard and to hear one another.

A written theory test will be given to all students to complete during the first session. There will be three levels from which to choose. Please allow enough time to finish the test (about thirty minutes) in addition to playing and discussion time with the adjudicators. A Lyon and Healy style 23 blond concert grand harp will be available for use as well as a troubadour harp.

Harpists who complete both sessions of the Music Education Evaluations will receive a beautiful certificate of participation signed by William Lovelace, Chair of the Music Education Committee, by Lucy Scandrett, President of the National American Harp Society, and by Gretchen Van Hoesen, President of the Pittsburgh Chapter of the American Harp Society.
