We will make a delivery to CHKD on Feb. 27 or 28 of 200 fabric hearts and 15 baby quilts. A delivery will be made to Riverside Hospital soon.



For the time being, we will continue to support these causes in 2023. If anyone has an idea for a new charity to support, you can contact me. I need the name of the charity, a contact person and what they need.

We will continue to collect quilts for end of life comfort care patients at Riverside Hospital. Lap or throw size quilts for both men and women are good for Riverside. Members can continue to make baby quilts and fabric hearts for Riverside and CHKD NICU. The fabric hearts can be made of cotton or flannel or both. You can bring donations to the meetings each month.
