- •Jonah likely lived just before and during the reign of King Jeroboam II (793-753)
- *After Elisha and contemporary with Hosea, Amos, and Isaiah
- *Likely visited Ninevah circa 760 B.C.

Background

- •The Assyrian Empire was the dominant world power from 900-700 B.C.
- •They were a cruel and ruthless people who were world renown for their cruel treatment of their enemies

Background

- During the early to mid 700's, the Assyrian Empire descended into confusion and chaos due to three rulers who followed after the Great Shalmaneser III.
- •King Jehu of Judah (841-814), appointed by Elisha (1 Kings 9:3ff) visited Shalmaneser to pay tribute to him
