Yes!! You're right! They are all stepping-stones in our congregation's "journey to generosity"!

In the summer newsletter, the Stewardship Ministry shared some thoughts on overcoming discomfort with talking about money in church, so we can freely explore how best to use the money God has blessed us with, to live out the love of Christ as a congregation.

<u>Summer children's program:</u> (Taking Care of God's Creation): our children have been identifying God's abundant gifts in every facet of life, and ways in which they can preserve, protect, and share their blessings with others, as Jesus taught us to do.

<u>Hymnal markers</u> spotlight various ministries we are currently able to share as a result of congregational offerings of time, talent and money. Some encourage us to envision new ways to "spread the love" of Christ within our church, and beyond our walls.

This is new for us, shifting our emphasis from budget-driven fundraising, to seeing our financial giving as both a thankful response to God's generosity in our lives, and a foundation for ministry planning in the coming year.

Over the past 10 months we've been exploring what whole-life generosity may look like in our personal lives, and our congregational life.

As we move into the annual pledge time we will necessarily focus on financial support, but this is not the end of our journey! It is another stepping stone on our path; it may even turn out to be a bridge to a greater experience of God's love. So stay tuned for more about our *"Love Runneth Over"* pledge program and be sure to join us in worship on **November 1st** for our **Celebration Sunday**.

We pray that you are as excited as we are to see where this "journey to generosity" may lead us!

What's the Blue Envelope Headstart Challenge??

On July 5, your Finance Committee launched the "B.E.H.C.". Each pew holds one or two striking blue envelopes, stamped "I am grateful to God for ". This is what it's about:

"Challenge":

- we are challenging you (and ourselves) to take regular inventory of the blessings God has brought into our lives
- challenging you to experience those blessings with gratitude
- challenging you to translate that gratitude into an active response to what God has done

Then, we invite you to use the blue envelope as a means of expressing your gratitude for what has been and what will be.

"Headstart":

- all blue envelope offerings are considered to be a "headstart" on the annual pledge drive which begins in October
- blue envelope offerings will be earmarked for 2016; none of the monies will be used this year (2015)
- blue envelope offerings will be counted separately from the regular offering; the total will be revealed when we kick off our pledge campaign (in October)

A couple of points you should know:

We have no expectations around the amount or frequency of offerings. This is an opportunity for each of us to draw closer to God as we reflect on the magnitude of his love and generosity, and to respond as we feel appropriate. There is a place on the blue envelope for your name - this is strictly optional. If you are unable to get to church, but would like to participate in the Blue Envelope Headstart Challenge, you may send in an offering and specify "Headstart Challenge" on your check. We know this is new to you; it's new to us, too. We're all used to thinking in terms of "paying the bills". Our hope, and our prayer, is that as we shift our focus more to an intentional awareness of God's blessings, a joyful sense of gratitude will be motivating our giving.

In line with this vision, the theme of this year's pledge drive is "Love Runneth Over"- another opportunity for each of us to identify how we experience the blessing of God's love, and how we wish to respond, and pass it on.

More about that will follow in several weeks. In the meantime, we are looking forward to sharing with you our tally of blessings and offerings from this Blue Envelope Headstart Challenge, next month.

Introduction to New Testament Offered

"And she wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger." Jesus is the central figure of the New

Testament and this third volume in the popular *Exploring* the Bible series examines Jesus in three distinct ways: A man like other men, a Jewish rabbi, and the Christ of Christian faith.

Then it's on to the cantankerous Paul, the other New Testament authors, and the wild and baffling book called Revelation.

Learn what Nazareth was like in the first century, discover what scholars know and don't know about Jesus as a historical figure, and explore how Paul really wrote all those letters. And who is the Antichrist anyway?

This is the third in a three part series addressing biblical literacy using the Dickinson Series created by the MA Bible Society.
