Jenean Hampton is on the Board of Directors. She was Kentucky's 57th Lieutenant Governor (2015-2019), the first African American to hold statewide office in Kentucky history. Pre-election, Jenean served in the U.S. Air Force seven years as a computer systems officer, deploying to Saudi Arabia during Operation Desert Storm. 25 + years of private sector experience includes automotive and corrugated packaging industries, rising in the latter from machine supervisor to plant manager. As Lt. Governor she was active in veterans affairs, emergency management, education and youth suicide prevention, visiting over 200 schools. Jenean was inducted into the KVHOF in 2015.

Army Private First Class, and later Air Force Reserves Technical Sergeant, Harvey Lee Hampton is a resident of Newport, Kentucky. At age 17, he was sent to South Korea and was 1 of only 28 men from his Company who survived the famous 1953 battle for Pork Chop Hill. Harvey took a bullet to his right bicep and shrapnel to his back, neck, and legs. Evacuated first to Seoul and then to Japan, fighting having ceased, Harvey volunteered to return to Korea where he observed enemy movements as part of a Headquarters Intelligence and Reconnaissance Platoon. Harvey was in Korea 14 months, after which he served in the Air Force Reserve at Wright Patterson Air Force Base in Ohio, first as a cargo specialist and then as a unit career advisor. Harvey is the recipient of 16 military awards and medals including The Purple Heart. As a civilian, he has received service certificates from the VFW, the National World War II Museum, and the Sons of the American Revolution.

Army and Air Force Reserve veteran Harvey Lee Hampton worked from 1956-1982 with the William Powell Valve Company in Cincinnati, Ohio, after leaving the Army. Harvey has been a member of the Southgate VFW in Kentucky for 26 years and served as its Post Commander. He has also been an active member in The American Legion, the DAV, and the Military Order of the Purple Heart. He is the recipient of the Sons of the American Revolution's prestigious "Service to Veterans" award. He also has been involved in collecting personal care items for VA hospitals and medical centers in Kentucky, Ohio, and Indiana. A prominent member of Sons of the American Revolution local Simon Kenton Chapter, Harvey has helped gather book donations from the Boone County (Kentucky) Library to establish libraries in Fort Thomas, Kentucky, Cincinnati, Chillicothe, Ohio and Indianapolis, Indiana. He is also a member of the Simon Kenton Chapter's Color Guard which regularly appears at patriotic celebrations and commemorations. Harvey has been a state officer in the Mayflower Society of Kentucky and the Kentucky Sons of the American Revolution. He is also one of the original founders of the 87th Aerial Port Squadron Association, an organization that focuses on maintaining the bonds and camaraderie of former members. A certified genealogist and historical researcher, Harvey specializes in extraction, for free, of information from military records for those seeking admission into various lineage organizations. Harvey has written 2 publications about his combat experiences in Korea: "Korea, MY Story," and "Remembering the Forgotten War-Korea 1950-1953."
