We held our first meeting of the year on February 3<sup>rd</sup> at the Embassy Suites in Lexington. We had an attendance of 30 members. HB Deatherage provided information on this years banquet and induction ceremony. So here we go: This year's Banquet and Induction ceremonies will be held at the Embassy Suites Hotel at 1801 Newtown Pike in Lexington.

August 8<sup>th</sup> will be the introduction of the Class of 2023. Weather permitting there will be a parachute jump by FASTRAX to honor the inductees. This will be held at the Embassy Suites Lexington.

September 8<sup>th</sup> will be the Banquet. We are expecting 500 or more attendees. The cost for the Banquet will be \$75 per adult and \$20 per child. The Induction ceremony will be held on September 9<sup>th</sup> at the Embassy Suites. There is no cost to attend the induction. All are welcome to attend that.

Cost to put on the Banquet and Induction is \$100,000 approximate. If you know of any organization that can help us to off set the cost through donations please let us know.

Heritage Bank has been kind enough to contribute \$3,500 to \$4,500 dollars to pay for the inductees and their spouse's meal at the banquet.

Decorations will consist of banners and flags being placed throughout the Embassy Suite's Lobby.

#### **Board of Directors**



**Donald Kiely, JR**. is on the Board of Directors. He lives in Villa Hills, KY, joined the Naval Reserves in 1956. He served aboard division ships as the Helmsman for the Sea and Anchor detail. As an employee of Cincinnati Bell, Don oversaw the 911 network operations and Public Safety Answering services in NKY.

In 2018 he received the NKY Police Chief's Presidents Award. For 35 years Don has been involved in community service, serving in the St. Pius Athletic Association, chairing the Newport Rotary's annual Night at the Races. He is currently a member of his HOA board, having been President and Vice President. Don also joined the Covington Catholic Gold Outing Committee which manages funds used for athletic programs at the school and for students who need financial assistance.

















Master Sgt. Emerson McAfee, "Mac", Madison Co., served in the air force for 24 years, enlisting in 1960. He served two tours in Vietnam, guiding 8-52 and other aircraft to targets using radar systems he helped develop. He also served as an instructor for new recruits.

Emerson focused his community service on supporting veterans. He designed and coordinated the building of monuments at Bluegrass Army

Depot, the National Air Force museum at Wright Patterson, and the historic Barksdale Air Force Base Museum to honor the "Combat Sky Spot" program. He has served as Chairman for six "Welcome Home Veterans" celebrations, continues to serve as president of Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 1066, developed the annual "Veteran Deputy Sheriff Award", and trains fifth graders in flag etiquette. He raises funds for veteran causes through car shows and works with Hospice Care. As a Trustee of his church, he coordinates the Christian Appalachian Project to distribute food and healthcare products to needy families. Ater a presentation urging support for the KY Veterans Hall of Fame, Mac created his own program to convince cities and counties to show support for the KVHOF by purchasing signs. Many other cities will soon experience a "Mac Attack" to join this group.

**Dave Jarrett** was selected as Veteran of the Year for the DAV of Kentucky at the DAV State Convention in June 2022. Award was given primarily for his body of work these past 21 years as a State Service Officer, assisting over 3000 veterans and their dependents. Dave has also served as DAV of KY Chapter 003 Commander; DAV of KY District 2 Commander; Chairman and PAO of JECVO (Joint Executive Committee of Veterans Organizations); and he has continued to serve as the DAV rep on the Board of the Kentucky Veterans Program Trust Fund; and on the Service Academy Selection Boards for both Senator Rand Paul and Congressman Brett Guthrie. Dave is a graduate of the United States Naval Academy (Class of 1969), served 2 tours in Vietnam, and was inducted into the KVHOF with the Class of 2015.

We have 11 Regions, or Chapters, set up for the Hall of Fame. We currently have Governors for four of them. We are looking for volunteers to head up the other seven regions.
